Oklahoma Wheat.
Oklahoma, Oct. 1.—The condition of winter wheat is only 38.9 per cent as against 97.7 per cent a year ago, according to a crop bulletin of the state board of agriculture issued today. The dry fall is given as the cause. The board reported a decrease of 31 per cent in the average yield of alfalfa. The cotton report is said to be encouraging, being estimated at 27,000 bales valued at \$42,000,000.


