 System Will Be Put into Effect on First of January.

A MAGNANIMOUS OFFER.
 Greenville Will Furnish Free Tuition and Guarantee Low Tuition Costs.
 In order to secure the Hunt County Summer Normal this city offers free tuition to all teachers of this county who are desirous of attending the normal.
 The committee consisting of Geo. Leary, J. P. Nelson, King Lightner and Jas. H. Robinson, representing the teacher club, and Hon. Wm. Pierson and Rev. Compton of Burton College met with the committee appointed by the Teachers' Institute to consider propositions looking to the location of the Hunt County Summer Normal. In view of the splendid success of the normal held here during the past summer and believing that with the street car system in operation and the many other improvements made during the past few months, this city is better prepared than ever before to properly care of the summer normal, the committee proposed to look after the normal in the name of the Greenville Chamber of Commerce. The normal, held here last summer, and also for one year of the instructors, which has gone on in the satisfactory to the committee having the matter in charge.
 The question of selecting the committee as well as the teachers to assist in conducting the normal will be left entirely with the executive committee, should the normal be held in Greenville. There will be no charges to teachers except for incidental expenses and this is guaranteed not to exceed \$2.00 for each teacher attending the normal.
 Prof. Mayo representing the North-west Texas Normal College, made a proposition to give a bonus of \$5000 or furnish four instructors, should the normal be held at Commerce. He also tendered the use of the college buildings and stated he would furnish on other instructors free, reserving the right, however, to name the instructor.
 After receiving the propositions of Greenville and Commerce, the latter committee, after due and careful consideration, and finally decided to place the matter before the Teachers' Institute as a referendum, with out any commitments.
 It is believed every citizen of this city who is interested in securing the Summer Normal to meet at the Central school building at 9 o'clock, this morning and show those in attendance upon the Institute that we are deeply interested in securing the great body of teachers for the summer.
