

STATE NEWS.

—Miss Lucy Miller, of East Sherman, was severely injured in a runaway on the 19th.

—L. L. North, a sawmill man living nine miles north of Gilmer, has made an assignment.

—Ben Hasburg, a clothier and gents' furnishing goods merchant at Denison, committed suicide on the 18th.

—The city council of Bellon has leased the waterworks of that place to H. A. Wear for five years at \$115 per month.

—There are 150 suits in the courts at Sherman to recover delinquent subscriptions to the Cotton Belt bonus.

—Judge J. R. Dickinson, judge of the 21st judicial district, died at his home in Waco after a protracted illness last Thursday.

—Jas. McDonald, a contractor between 40 and 50 years old, dropped dead at San Antonio while walking along Commerce street.

—A publishing company has been organized at Schulenberg which will start a new paper to be called the Schulenberg News.

—Ben Gillespie, a white man from the Chickasaw nation, has been lodged in jail at Dallas on the charge of assaulting his niece.

—Joe Wilkins and Jim Stevens, the San Antonio policemen who killed C. W. Collins, have been admitted to bail in the sum of \$5000 each.

—A water spout occurred on the Southern Pacific road near Haymond station the other day, in which several lives were reported lost.

—A stranger named Robinson from Memphis, Tenn., attempted to board a passing train at Longview, when his leg struck a switch target, breaking it in two places.

—C. M. Click, a postal clerk, recovered judgment for \$3500 in the district court of El Paso against the Atehon, Topeka & Santa Fe road for personal injuries.

—On the 18th at Wills Point W. R. Collier, a prescription clerk in a drugstore, shot and instantly killed Dr. E. G. Tines. Tines was drunk, disputed a medicine bill and drew a knife on Collier.

—John Swayne, for many years sheriff of Grimes county, was killed two miles and a half from Navasota on Thursday in the river bottom by Bill Smith, a negro, who split his head open with an ax.

—While Mrs. D. H. Lindsey was engaged in cooking a meal at Tyler on the 18th she endeavored to hurry the fire by pouring oil on it. The flames instantly shot up, the can exploded and saturating her clothing and she was fatally burnt.

—Milt Chambers, of Lenora, a small station on the Frisco road, owed John Duff's mother \$3 board bill. Duff met him in the road and drew his gun on Chambers and made him pay it. He was subsequently arrested for robbery.

—E. A. Henegar, from Gordon, was arrested and taken to Dallas and part under bond by the United States commissioner on the charge of refusing to continue the work of taking the census after being engaged at it for four days.

—Oliver Renfro, alias Harris, a burly old darkey 60 years old, living near East Hamilton, San Augustine county, flogged his 12-year-old grandson so unmercifully that the boy died shortly afterward in great agony.

—Gilbert S. Nichols, postmaster at Velasco, committed suicide on the 18th by shooting himself through the heart. A note left behind by him admits that he was considerably behind in his postoffice accounts.

—The defendants, G. M. Wickes, the colored justice, of the peace and others of Bastrop county concerned in the Cedar creek killing several months ago, have been granted a new trial on the ground that the verdict was not clearly worded.

—Rev. R. L. Dabney, professor of philosophy in the state university, has resigned on account of bad health. The regents accepted his resignation but appointed him emeritus professor with a division of the salary between him and an assistant to be selected at the next meeting of the board.

—The dead body of an old lady known as Aunt Hoga Garrett was found on the roadside near Macune, San Augustine county, with her head beat into a pulp and her throat cut from ear to ear. The wife of George Paschal, her grandson, was arrested on suspicion and broke down and confessed the crime.

—Last Thursday night W. G. Johnson, of Galveston, took his family out bathing. A little son got beyond his depth and his father in attempting to rescue him was drowned. Two men named Hess and Moore chanced to be near in a skiff and they saved the life of the boy.


