Letter to Lathrop & Liverman.

Dear Sir: A pound of good meat and no bone is worth more than a half pound of meat and a half pound of bone; but here are, as you say, a great many people who won't pay more than a certain price by the pound. Give 'em bone; that right; give 'em plenty of bone!

There are people who won't pay more than \$1.50 a gallon for paint; give 'em bone!

There's no better school than experience; cost is high; but the lesson is never forgotten.
