Col. Prentiss Ingraham.

Col. Prentiss Ingraham, who died in the Soldiers' Home, Beauvoir, Mississippi, August 16th, 1904, was well known to the people of Claiborne county. He was wont to claim himself a Claibornite to the writer, notwithstanding Adams county gave him a birth place.

Colonel Ingraham was a soldier, poet, journalist, novelist and traveler—in fact a Southern Admirable Critchton.

Beginning his military career in the Confederacy as a private to the command of a regiment, the martial blood of his distinguished parent, Rev. J. H. Ingraham of the Episcopal church, was in him and he led the life of a soldier of fortune. The list is long of some Episcopal clergymen in the ranks of soldiers of fortune. Fighting for any country and serving under any flag, he attached himself to the Mexican General Jaures against the French in Mexico, became a staff officer in the Austrian Army in the Austro-Prussian War, fought for the English in Egypt and India and was a Pasha in the Sultan's Army in the Greco-Turkish War.

It is as a writer of weird tales he is known to the imaginative youth of this country. They breathed the melodrama of Charles Reade and the supernatural of Rider Haggard. He was the father of that school of fiction refined by Reade and polished by Haggard.

Colonel Ingraham's poetry was fugitive. He was a visitor to many of the homes in this county and amused himself with his muse. At the commencement of his literary career his NOM DE PLUME was scattered or varied with his whims. Some said he was author of "Introspection" which is in the collection of George Arnold's poems. He wrote of himself in the P. S. to "Introspection" "Mr. BITTER experience is not a personal acquaintance, tho' Cruel Pride is a particular friend."

Colonel Ingraham's soul goes on thro' the Valley of Mystery, and "Till the church yard's myrtle blossoms above" his grave.
