ANOTHER SCRAP BY THE BOERS.

A Large British Force With Six
Guns Captured.

Bushmankop, Saturday March 31.—The British force commanded by Colonel Broadwood, consisting of the Tenth Hussars, household cavalry, two horse batteries and a force of mounted infantry under Colonel Pilcher, which had been garrisoning Thabaucha, was obliged, in consequence of the near approach of a large force of Boers, to leave last night. Colonel Broadwood marched to the Bloemfontein water works south of the Modder River where he encamped at 4 o'clock this morning. At early dawn the camp was shelled by the enemy from another point. Colonel Broadwood sent off a convoy with the batteries, while the rest of the force remained to act as a rear guard.

The convoy arrived at a deep spruit where the Boers were concealed and the entire body walked into ambush and was captured, together with six guns.

The loss of life was not great, since most of the British had walked into the trap before a shot was fired. General Colville's division, which left Bloemfontein early this morning, arrived here at noon and he is now shelling the Boers.

BAILEY FOR U.S. SENATOR.

Montague county has instructed for Bailey for senator. Out of 4000 votes 3500 were for Bailey and 500 for Chilton.

Wise county has held its primaries and instructed for Joe W. Bailey.

One precinct in Washington county has instructed for Joe Bailey and so they fall into line.

Hon. J. C. Kindred, candidate for state senator from Colorado county, is for Joe Bailey for senator. A campaign committee has been organized in Hill county.

The capacity of the court houses is being tested everywhere by the crowds who come to hear Mr. Bailey speak.

Tarrant county held its primaries last Saturday and can now be placed in the Bailey column.

State Senator Odell says that Hill county is safe for Bailey.

Bloemfontein.

London, March 30.—The Bloemfontein correspondent of the Morning Post, telegraphing Wednesday says: "President Kruger boasts his intention to retake Bloemfontein within a week, and it appears probable that the Boers are advancing in force southward."
