Official Notice.

For October Term of District Court
It is ordered that for the next term of court, the Grand Jury will be summoned to appear on the 1st day of the term at 10 o'clock a. m. There will be no petit jury until Monday of the 2nd week, when the jury civil docket will be called for trial, and no jury case on trial docket will be set for a later day than Tuesday of the second week. The non-jury civil docket will be called for orders at 11 o'clock a. m. Monday of the 1st week and will be called for final disposition at 2 o'clock p. m. same day. The criminal docket will be called for trial at 9 o'clock a. m. Monday of the third week and the call will continue until that docket is disposed of. No contested civil case will be tried after the second week. The clerk is requested to have this order published when the jury lists for the next term are published and this order will continue in force as to subsequent terms until otherwise directed.—Hallettsville Herald.

Says They Can Be Expelled.

New York, Sept. 10th.—Justice McAdam, of the New York Supreme court gives the opinion that Emma Goldman and other anarchists who are naturalized, can be expelled from the country on the ground that they have sworn falsely in that they have obtained certificates of citizenship by fraud in testifying that they are attached to the principles of government and would support its constitutional laws.
