Mr. Grigsby's Death.

Mrs. Grigsby of this city is in receipt of the following letter, detailing the death of her husband, Mr. R. H. Grigsby, which occurred in Mexico:

Campo del Rey, Sonora, Mexico, February 20, 1904.

Mrs. R. A. Grigsby,
 Palestine, Texas:

It is with great regret and deepest sympathy that I write you today in regard to what you have already heard—your husband's death.

Mr. Grigsby contracted a heavy cold and pleurisy, which later developed into pneumonia, the result of which we so much deplore. Everything possible was done for him. The doctor feared from the first, although the disease was not in its worst form by any means; that he simply slept himself away without pain or suffering.

On account of the strict laws in this country, prohibiting the removal of bodies until the expiration of two years, and on account of other existing circumstances, we buried him yesterday afternoon in a most beautiful spot. He was lowered to his last resting place by loving and sympathetic hands.

Although we could not have such a service as we would have liked, there were many silent and spoken tributes of the high regard and esteem held for your husband.

 To the Sheriff or any Constable of Anderson County—Greeting:

You are hereby Comanded, That by making publication of this citation in some newspaper published in the county of Anderson, if there be a newspaper published in said county (but if not, then in the nearest county where a newspaper is published), once in each week for eight successive weeks, previous to the return day hereof, you summon the heirs of J. H. L. Brashears, whose residence is unknown, to be and appear before the honorable District Court, at the next regular term thereof, to be holden in the county of Anderson, at the courthouse thereof, in Palestine, on the twelfth Monday after the first Monday in February, 1904, being the 25th day of April, 1904, then and there to answer the petition of Thos. E. Greenwood, plaintiff, filed in said court on the 26th day of February, A. D. 1904, against the said heirs of J. H. L. Brashears, defendant, the file number of said suit being No. 6981, and plaintiff's cause of action being stated as follows: That plaintiff on January 1, 1904, was in the lawful possession, as owner in fee simple, of 262 2-10 acres of land in Anderson county, patented to the heirs of J. H. L. Brashears, and that on that day defendants unlawfully entered upon and dispossessed plaintiff of same and continue to withhold from plaintiff the possession thereof; that defendants claim as patentees, but that prior to June 6, 1856, J. H. L. Brashears and his heirs had conveyed the certificate by virtue of which said land was located and patented to Geo. Metz, under whom plaintiff claims. Herein fail not but have you then and there before said court this writ, with your return thereon, showing how you have executed the same.

Metcalf survey, and that on that day defendants unlawfully entered upon and dispossessed plaintiff of same and continue to withhold from plaintiff the possession thereof; that defendant's claim arises from the fact that though they executed and delivered a deed conveying the title to 346 acres embracing the land sued for to Ben Parker, under whom plaintiff claims, in 1874, yet their acknowledgments to said deed were not certified as required by law.
