D. 1904, the same being the 28th day of November A. D. 1904, then and there to answer a petition filed in said Court on the 24th day of September A. D. 1904, in a suit, numbered on the docket of said Court No. 7154, wherein R. L. Dean and W. L. Johnson, plaintiffs, and the heirs of J. G. George are defendants, and said petition alleging that on January 1, 1904, plaintiffs were in the lawful possession, as the owners in fee simple, of the 160 acres of land in Anderson county, patented to J. G. George on March 8, 1861, by patent No. 44, Vol. 34, that on January 1, 1904, defendants unlawfully entered upon and dispossessed plaintiffs of said tract of land, and withhold from plaintiffs the possession thereof. Plaintiffs pray judgment for the title to and possession of said land.

Herein fail not, but have before said Court, at the aforesaid next regular term, this writ, with your return thereon, showing how you have executed the same.
