Medical aid was summoned. It was pronounced seriously burned, but will soon recover, if bad complications do not ensue.

This morning Mr. Ewing stated the child was getting along nicely. He says the lye had been wiped from the floor, and the child only got what its moist hands picked up from the floor in crawling.
