No Confirmatory Information Received at St. Petersburg.

St. Petersburg, May 27.—The admiralty has no information confirmatory Admiral Togo south of Formosa, While it is considered possible that there may have been a brush between scouts, the idea of an open battle with Togo is not credited in the best informed naval circles, where the opinion is expressed that Admiral Togo would not dare risk bringing his battleships so far south to meet Admiral Rojestvensky. It is believed that Togo will try to keep in touch with the Russians by means of fast cruisers and await his approach off the Japanese coast. cording to the admiralty calculations Rojestvensky should now be far out in the Pacific, almost 1000 miles northeast of the place where the battle is reported to have occurred.

SHEA UPHELD.

Judge Kohlsaat Says He Need Not Answer Incriminating Questions.


