FINSTAD ARRESTED.

This Was Done Simply In Compliance With Mexican Law.

El Paso, Dec. 25.—L. H. Finstad of Los Angeles, at whose home two Americans were killed and one wounded at Diaz, Mexico, has been arrested by the Mexican authorities.

Finstad's arrest, it is believed, has no significance in itself, being ordered simply in compliance with Mexican law.

Mrs. Finstad, who arrived here from Los Angeles, gives the following as the correct names of those who were arrested at her husband's home: Olin Finstad, Los Angeles, and C. W. Murray, Los Angeles, brother of Mrs. Finstad; Robert T. Rutherford, Philadelphia; Louis C. Coughner, Los Angeles.

Consul Edwards received the following message from Enrique Cuel, governor of Chihuahua, bearing on the arrest of Finstad: "Finstad arrested for apparent complicity of two Americans (meaning Rutherford and Murray) at the Buiche ranch."

Will Return to Philadelphia. Washington, Dec. 25.—The state department has sent instructions by telegraph to the United States consular agent at Diaz, Mexico, to endeavor to secure and return to Philadelphia the bodies of the two Americans, Rutherford and Murray, killed near that place by bandits.

LONG JOURNEY.

Woman Walked All the Way From Kentucky to Sherman.

Sherman, Dec. 25.—A white woman was found crouched on a pile of crossing at the first grade crossing of the Houston and Texas Central railway shivering violently as if she had a chill. She was brought to the court house, and after she had had something to eat and a fire, she expressed a willingness to talk.

She said her name was Mrs. Mary Ann or Malley Duval, and that she walked all the way from Litchfield, Grayson county, Kentucky to Pismo, Tex., and had been in Galin county three weeks, and had started to walk back to Kentucky, when overtaken by the storm. Her father's name is White, she stated, and he is a farmer near McKinney. On order of County Judge, she was taken to the court house, and all efforts are being made to communicate with her parents.
