## FIFTY CASUALTIES RESULT OF COLLISION

EXPRESS TRAIN AND FREIGHT TRAIN CAME TOGETHER AT HIGH SPEED—DEBRIS IS HALF CLEARED AND

## Twenty Bodies Removed

Accident Occurred Between Berlin and Hamburg—Details Lacking, But Report Says Much Suffering Has Resulted As a Result.

Special to the Herald. Berlin, Aug. 7.—An express train bound for Berlin from Hamburg collided with a freight train, smashing the passenger train into kindling wood. Fifty casualties are reported. Details are lacking.

Latest reports from the wreck say twenty bodies have been removed, and the debris has been only half cleared. The trains are reported to have met at high speed, and the passenger coaches piled upon each other. There is terrible suffering reported, and it has been very difficult for the rescuers to do their work.

## SAILORS POLICING BOMBARDED CITY

Special to the Herald. Tangier, Morocco, Aug. 7.—The two hundred and fifty sailors from the ships are now guarding Casa Blanca, and order has been temporarily restored.

Will Maintain Authority of Sultan. Special to the Herald. Paris, France, Aug. 7.—France sent a note to all the powers announcing the policing of Casa Blanca will be undertaken jointly by France and Spain. It states a determination to maintain the authority of the Sultan.

## DENIES COALITION HAD EVER EXISTED

Chicago, Ill., Aug. 7.—Attorney Moritz Rosenthal, special counsel for the Standard Oil Company, speaking of the rumored coalition between the Standard Company and the railroads, said: "No such secret arrangement exists, and there has never been such an arrangement between the railroads and the Standard. We do not believe we will ever have to pay the fine imposed on the company by Judge Landis."

## OVERSEER VOLVA WILL MAKE FIGHT

Special to the Herald. Chicago, Ill., Aug. 7.—Overseer Volva of the city of Zion, has announced he will fight for the possession of the town Dowie built in the circuit court. He defies the decision of Judge Landis in ordering the lace factory to be sold to satisfy a judgment.

Theosophical Temple Is Located. Special to the Herald. Newberryport, Mass., Aug. 7.—The grand central temple of universal brotherhood of the Theosophical Society is to be located three miles from here, on the Merrimack river. Mrs. Catherine Tingley, the high priestess, selected the site.

## STATE LEGISLATION UNCONSTITUTIONAL

C., Aug. 7.—The administration authorities hold that the action of the legislatures of Alabama and Arkansas, in passing laws prohibiting the transfer of railroad cases from the state to the Federal courts, is in violation of the constitution of the United States. The alleged offense in both states is the transfer of civil suits brought against the railroads, from State to Federal courts.

Burton Will Retire. Special to the Herald. Washington, D. C., Aug. 7.—Representative Burton of Ohio announces that he will retire from the chairmanship of the committee on rivers and harbors.

A STRONG BELIEF IS CURRENT THAT GRAND JURY IN ITS INVESTIGATION AT CHICAGO WILL INQUIRE INTO

## Connection of Harriman

With the Management of the Chicago & Alton Railroad, and That Criminal Prosecution Will Follow Against Men High in Life.

C., Aug. 7.—A strong belief is current that the grand jury in its investigation at Chicago will inquire particularly into the connection of Harriman with the management of the Chicago & Alton, and that criminal prosecutions will follow against Harriman, Rockefeller and others high up the scale, connected with the oil companies and the railroad.

## LUMBER CORPORATIONS PLANNING FOR DEFENSE

New York, Aug. 7.—Officials of lumber corporations having interests in the Central and Western states are gathering here to plan for defense against a campaign to be launched against them in St. Louis next week. A conference of the attorney generals of the Mississippi valley states to outline a concerted action against trusts and railroads begins Monday in St. Louis.

A Meningitis Specific. Cleveland, O., Aug. 6.—According to private advices received last night from New York and from Castalla, O., the wealth of John D. Rockefeller has made possible a cure for meningitis. Dr. Simon Flexner, the New York dispatcher says, has discovered a serum which will cure the heretofore fatal disease.

Experiments made at Castalla have demonstrated the efficiency of the serum. Dr. Flexner is head of the Rockefeller Institute.
