

Sir John Charles Bell, Soon to Take Office, 63 Years Old Today.

Sir John Charles Bell, who is soon to take office as Lord Mayor of London, was born October 16, 1844. He received a grammar school education and engaged immediately in business. in 1882 he began his public career as a member of the Court of Common Council, where he served on a number of important committees. In 1894 he was elected to the Court of Aldermen, and in 1902 was made sheriff of the city of London, and was further honored by receiving the rank and title of knight. Sir John is a man of great wealth, being largely interested in brewing companies and a number of other concerns. As Lord Mayor of London he will have no ardnous duties to perform, his chief function be ing to represent the city on great civic occasions. One of the first of these will be to extend the civic welcome to the Emperor and Empress of Germany on the occasion of their visit to London next month. The function will take place at the Guild hall and will be attended with much pomp and ceremony.


