To Water Consumers

The use of hand hose without a nozzle for any purpose whatever is prohibited, and in no case shall a nozzle larger than one-eighth inch diameter be allowed and the use of which shall not exceed four hours per day, and for no purpose other than as stated in the application and for such use as payment is made.

streets or sidewalks unless special terms be made for same. Permits for sprinkling lawns will be issued from May 1st to November 1st not to exceed four hours in any one day, nor at any other time than between the hours of six and eight a. m. and five and eight p. m., which shall constitute the season for sprinkling, and for which the entire payment must be made in advance, according to the season rates.

In no case shall any one be permitted to use water for sprinkling

In case of fire, no hose shall be used other than for the fire, and there shall be no other use of water except as absolutely necessary so long as the fire pressure is on. Any person violating any of the foregoing rules shall forfeit all payments made and the supply of water shall be at once stopped without any notice, and shall not be again turned on without an extra charge of \$1.00 for the trouble of turning off and on.
