SENATOR PHIL C. KNOX

Of Pennsylvania Fifty-Five Years Old Today—Indorsed For the Presidency By Home State.

Alexander C. Knox, United States senator from Pennsylvania and indorsed by the republicans of that state for the presidential nomination, was born in Brownsville, Pa., May 6, 1853. He received his education in Mt. Union College, Ohio, from which institution he graduated in 1872. Three years later he was admitted to the bar and began the practice of law in Pittsburg. In 1876 he was appointed assistant United States district attorney for the western district of Pennsylvania, which position he resigned at the end of a year to resume his legal practice. The law firm of

which he was a member became one of the most prominent in Pittsburg, representing the interests of the large industrial corporations of that city. For a quarter of a century or longer Knox took an active interest in republican politics of Pittsburg, but never sought public office. In 1901 upon the earnest solicitation of the president, Knox left private life and accepted the position of attorney general in the cabinet of President McKinley. A few years later he was appointed to fill the vacancy in the United States senatorship caused by the death of Senator Quay and in 1905 Senator Knox was elected for the full term.


