The Meat Proposition.
At a meeting of the central committee, held in the Board of Trade rooms last night, some thirty representatives of various organizations responded. One of the greatest problems confronting the arrangement committee is the meat supply. They have contracted for three thousand pounds of meat, but at last night's meeting the general opinion was that this amount would be insufficient. Figuring on eight thousand people for dinner, the arrangement committee will contract for four thousand pounds of meat, giving an average of one-half pound to each person. This amount may have to be increased.

Ample Police Protection.
The labor unions want the people to understand that they will have charge of Michaux Grove on September 7 and will see that the ladies, children and visitors are protected. They will not be pushed out when dinner is announced. It is the plan of the grounds committee to have four tables, aggregating six thousand feet in length, so that all may eat at one and the same time. Each organization to be represented in the celebration is requested and urged to select one or two good, level-headed men to act as deputies that day. After the selection hand the names to City Marshal Perry and he will take steps to have them sworn in as special officers.

Veterans Are Invited.
At the meeting last night it was the sense of the body that the Confederate Veterans of Anderson county be represented in the parade, and an invitation will be forwarded to the proper officers at once asking them to join in. A float will be provided for these old heroes.

ADVERTISING PAYS.
New York Druggist Devises a New Way of Getting Business.

New York, Aug. 26.—An enterprising if not philanthropic druggist who has a store at the lower end of Manhattan has devised a new means of getting business at the expense of considerable suffering on the part of the unfortunate victims. The druggist places a stray banana skin in front of his pharmacy, in hope that some one will slip on it, which of course will result in his being carried into the drug store to have his bruises cared for. Rarely a week passes but some person slips on the treacherous skin and immediately is carried into the pharmacy with a dozen or more curious citizens following. The druggist then dresses the wounds with a salve he tells the crowd is his own invention and warranted to cure all ills. It is probable that the enterprising druggist will continue this practice until the policeman on the beat slips on the peel, when an investigation may follow that will cause the pharmacist to adopt some safer means of publicity.

Weather Conditions.
The low pressure area has moved from Montana to the Dakotas, but

rain has fallen only in Nebraska, while dry conditions rule elsewhere west of the Mississippi river. A depression on the Alabama coast has caused showers on the Middle and East Gulf coast. High pressure continues over the lakes and North Atlantic states; it is attended by cooler weather over the North Atlantic states and rain as far south as Florida. It is now raining in Washington from Boston and Washington.

The daily weather map is beginning to show a fall type for the northern half of the country. The temperature over the Northwestern border and Northern Rocky Mountains ranges between 42 and 52; in the upper lakes

it averages 60. Fair weather is indicated tonight and Thursday in the vicinity of Palestine.
