

## ANOTHER GOOD SERMON

Heard By Large Audience at the Congregational Church Last Night. "Three G's" Tonight.

"The Three R's" was the subject of the Rev. W. Irving Carroll at the Congregational church last night. The congregation was highly gratified, because the three following fundamental truths of the bible were made plain:

First. Ruin by the fall of our first parents, Dr. Carroll showed conclusively that man, after he was created in the image of God, fell to an awful moral ruin, and fallen Adam begot children after fallen Adam's likeness, and not after the likeness of God. (Gen. 5:13.) Adam is called a son of God, but Seth is called the son of Adam. (Lu. 3:38.) Dr. Carroll says the scriptures refute the popular theory of the universal fatherhood of God. He quoted the Lord Jesus Christ's own words from John 8:44, which says of those who are not believers on Him: "Ye are of your father, the devil, and the lusts of your father ye will do," etc. He also quoted Mark 7:21-23, and mentioned the thirteen awful things that proceed out of the heart of men, which proves their ruin by the fall, and that they are not the children of God, but of the evil one.

Second. The second R is redemption by the shed blood of the Lord Jesus Christ for the ruined race. Dr. Carroll made it very plain that men need more and more in their ruined state, to boast in the blood of Christ, rather than in their behavior, if they expect to be saved. He did not spare those who preach bloodless sermons and are expecting to get people to heaven on the merits of what they are and have done, called good works, instead of preaching that "the blood of Jesus Christ, God's Son, cleanseeth from all sin." (John 1:7.) "In whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace." (Eph. 1:7.) "For as much as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot." (1 Pe. 1:18-19.)

Third. The third R is "Regeneration by the Holy Spirit." Titus 3:5 says: "Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but by His mercy, He saved us, by the washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy Spirit." Dr. Carroll said this does not mean the reformation of society or of politics, but a new birth, which gives a new life to the individual who will trust the Lord Jesus Christ as a personal Savior. He quoted John 1:12-13, which says: "But as many as received Him (Christ) to them gave He power to become the children of God, who were born, not of flesh, nor of blood, nor by the will of man, but of God." Dr. Carroll plead with the unsaved to be born again and believe the word of God will not return unto Him void, but

will accomplish that which He pleases.

The subject of repentance and of hell and of faith will be preached by Dr. Carroll this week, and each subject will be thoroughly presented from the scriptures, and profitably, to all who hear him.

Tonight he will preach on "Three G's." Reporter.

## THE SCHOOL BOARD MET

Salaries Were Fixed and Some Teachers Were Elected For the Next School Term.

The school board met in called session at the Board of Trade rooms last evening at 8 o'clock. There were present President F. C. Eason, Secretary C. A. Sterne, Trustees Leo Davidson, Geo. P. Barnes, F. C. McWhorter, J. W. Nance, W. H. Mamliton, and Superintendent Walker King.

The matter of fixing salaries for the ensuing term came up, and it was voted to pay the principal of the Third Ward school \$75 per month for the year, and Miss Eva Fullinwider, on motion, was re-elected to this position.

It was voted to pay the principal of the grammar school at the Central building \$60 a month for the year, and Miss Puhl was re-elected to this position.

The salary of the teacher of English in the High School was fixed at \$70 a month for the term, and Miss Kate Fullinwider was re-elected.

Also the salary for the teacher of history was fixed at \$70 a month for the term, and Miss Fannie Lou Fullinwider was re-elected.

Miss Lellet Richter of Brenham was elected as teacher of German, and a salary of \$85 a month was voted.

Mr. H. C. Ray of Corsicana was elected teacher of Latin, and his salary was fixed at \$85 per month.

The old schedule of pay for teachers was adopted, which is \$40 per month for the first year for inexperienced teachers; \$45 for second year teachers, and \$50 for third year teachers.

President Eason announced the following committees for the ensuing year:

On Finance—W. M. Hamilton chairman, Leo Davidson, Geo. P. Barnes.

On Course of Study—J. W. Nance chairman, W. M. Hamilton.

On School Property—C. F. McWhorter chairman, J. W. Nance.

On Rules, Grievances and Complaints—Geo. P. Barnes chairman, W. M. Hamilton.

On Recommendation of Teachers—W. M. Hamilton chairman, C. A. Sterne.

On School Supplies—Leo Davidson chairman, C. F. McWhorter.

Various matters pertaining to the schools were discussed, after which the board adjourned.

The election of other teachers will take place a little later.

### JUDGE DOOM DEAD AT AUSTIN.

Acted as Pallbearer at a Funeral Earlier in the Day.

Austin, Texas, May 24.—Judge David W. Doom, for many years one of the foremost lawyers of Austin, died at his home in this city at 9:40 o'clock tonight of heart failure. He attended to business today as usual, acted as a pallbearer at the funeral of Mrs. Dora Waller Byran, and went home at the usual hour on a street car, seemingly in good health. His family is so shocked over his sudden collapse that the details of his death are unobtainable.

Judge Doom was born at Jasper June 15, 1848. He served for a short time in the Confederate army; was admitted to the bar in 1870, and located at Austin in 1874, at which place he resided continuously until his death. He has been quite a noted lawyer, especially in land litigation.
