

## WERE GIVEN DIPLOMAS

Graduation Exercises at the United States Military Academy at West Point This Morning.

(Herald Special.)

West Point, N. Y., June 11.—Beneath the Stars and Stripes, under the spreading branches of a grove of sturdy elms in front of the cadet chapel, the class of 1909 of the United States Military Academy received their diplomas today from the hands of Secretary of War Dickinson. On the platform were gathered the secretary of war, Major General Bell, chief of staff; Colonel Hugh L. Scott, superintendent of the academy, prominent army officers from New York, Washington and other points, several members of congress and many other distinguished people in military and civil life.

The graduation exercises took place at 11 o'clock. The whole battalion, headed by the Military Academy Band, marched to the spot in front of the old chapel which has marked the scene of the graduation of every class since the institution was established.

The program of exercises included music by the band, prayer by the chaplain, an address to the graduation class by the president of the board of visitors, an address by the superintendent of the academy and the delivery of the diplomas by the secretary of war.

### DISAPPOINTMENT EXPRESSED

Over the Act of Governor Campbell Vetoing the Mining Bill.

San Antonio, Texas, June 10.—Considerable disappointment has been aroused in Texas by the act of the governor in vetoing the mining bill passed by the last legislature. Unfortunately, under the present laws governing state lands, it is practically impossible to develop their mineral resources, as the individual is not guaranteed sufficient return for the risk of prospecting. These public lands lie, to a great extent, in Southwest Texas. In the mineral belt in Brewster county, on privately owned land, has already been developed the greatest quicksilver district in the world. These mines are now in active operation and immense profit has been taken from them. It is a generally admitted fact that on the adjoining public land similar

mines have been developed in the last twenty years has produced silver to the value of twelve million dollars. The governor held that the law passed contained irrelevant and unconstitutional subjects. Its veto means a check in the mining developments except on privately owned land.

### AGAINST THE LAW.

Missouri Court Says Merger of Presbyterian Churches Is Illegal.

Jefferson City, Mo., June 9.—The Missouri supreme court declares the union of the Presbyterian and Cumberland Presbyterian churches to be illegal. In an opinion written by Judge Graves the court decrees that if the churches unite the Presbyterian church, U. S. A., must so amend its creeds, doctrines and form of government as to make them conform to that of the Cumberland Presbyterians, and then come in under the jurisdiction of the Cumberland Presbyterian church. The opinion is contrary to the action of the general assemblies of the two churches. In 1906 the Cumberland Presbyterian church dropped its organization, lost its identity and became part and parcel of the Presbyterian church of the United States.

## PALESTINE FOR THE JEWS

The Zionist Movement Is One of the Important Questions of Meeting of American Zionists.

(Herald Special.)

New York, June 11.—Delegates are already arriving in New York to attend the annual convention of the Federation of American Zionists, which will hold its sessions in this city during the next four or five days. Several things combine to give promise of the most important as well as the largest convention ever held by the organization.

Among the more important questions to be considered is the movement seeking the restoration of Palestine to the Jewish people. In view of the recent changes in the Turkish empire and of the friendly attitude which the Young Turks have evinced towards the aspirations of the Zionists, the convention will be of unusual interest. The invitation which has been formally extended by the Turkish parliament to the oppressed Jews of Russia to come and settle within the empire makes the present movement in Zionist activities all the more significant. In connection with the progress of the movement it is expected that messages will be received by the convention from the foremost leaders of the Zionist movement in Europe.

### REFUSED TO EXTRADITE.

Oklahoma Governor Will Not Surrender Men Wanted in Texas.

Austin, Texas, June 10.—Governor Haskell of Oklahoma has declined to honor the requisition of Governor Campbell for the extradition of Chapman, Brown and Grimes, who are wanted at Del Rio on a charge of uttering a forged instrument in connection with alleged land frauds relating to the lands of Kickapoo Indians. Governor Haskell's letter is brief, merely conveying information that his views concerning the matter do not justify his honoring the requisition. The action of the governor of Oklahoma apparently terminates the matter, as there is no means of securing the presence of Chapman, Brown and Grimes except through the executive department of the new state. It will be remembered that at the request of Oklahoma Governor Campbell consented to a hearing recently at which was discussed a proposition to withdraw this requisition. Governor Campbell, however, declined to withdraw his request. Secretary Barton will notify George Thurmond, district attorney at Del Rio, of Governor Haskell's refusal to surrender the men wanted.

## TO DEDICATE BIG BRIDGE

Celebration at New York Will Begin Saturday and Continue Through the Coming Week.

New York, June 11.—Preparations on an elaborate scale have been completed for the dedication of the new Queensborough bridge, connecting Manhattan and the Borough of Queens. The bridge is one of the greatest structures of its kind in the world. It is 8,617 feet in length and cost \$12,500,000.

The celebration arranged to mark the formal opening will begin tomorrow and continue through the coming week. Months have been spent on the details of the elaborate program. A parade which will include military, civic and political organizations, a Marathon race and an athletic carnival, and folk dances by the public school children in costume are among the features of the celebration.
