THE CRISIS IS PENDING CONDUCTOR WAS KILLED

In the Nicaraguan Revolution—Attack on Managua Expected Within Forty-Eight Hours.

(Herald Special.) Bluefields, Nicaragua, Feb. 9.—A wireless message to Colon says an attack on Managua is almost certain within the next forty-eight hours. According to these messages arriving here today from the frontier, General Chamorro has withdrawn from Boaca and is now marching at the head of 25,000 troops to Managua, less than forty miles away. The main body of the government army, sent out to check the advance of Chamorro, is held back at Santa Domingo by General Mena and there is practically no army to oppose Chamorro's advance against the capital. Reports of the government success continue, but are wholly discredited by other dispatches received at the revolutionary headquarters. Couriers from the front, just arrived, confirm the report of sweeping victories at LaGarita and Santa Clara by General Mena. The attempt by the government forces to surprise Chamorro at Boaca after its investment by the revolutionary forces last Friday, was a failure, and Chamorro easily broke through the enemy's lines and started on his western trip to Managua. It is thought possible that Chamorro will not risk an attack on Managua until he is reinforced by Mena's forces, but it is announced that his army alone is strong enough to take the city.

And a Score of Passengers Injured in Kansas City, St. Louis and Colorado Train Wreck.

(Herald Special.) Union, Mo., Feb. 9.—Conductor J. D. Reach of St. Louis was instantly killed and a score of passengers injured, some seriously, when an east bound passenger train on the Kansas City, St. Louis and Colorado railroad was wrecked one mile east of here today. Two combination express and baggage cars went down a twenty foot embankment, one Pullman car was derailed, and the tender of the engine was overturned. The injured were brought here on a special.

DR. HYDE IS ARRESTED

Charged With Causing Death of Col. Swope By Administering Strychnine In Capsule.

(Herald Special.) Kansas City, Mo., Feb. 9.—The coroner's jury returned a verdict this afternoon finding that Col. Swope's death was caused by a capsule containing strychnine, administered by Dr. B. C. Hyde.

Earlier Report.

(Herald Special.) Kansas City, Mo., Feb. 9.—Attorneys for Dr. B. C. Hyde today refused to allow Hyde to take the stand in the inquest into the death of Colonel Thomas Swope. Virgil Conklin, prosecuting attorney, declared he had enough evidence to make his case after Hyde's refusal to testify, and arrests in the case are expected at any moment.

The inquest has been finished and the case given to the coroner's jury. Little evidence of importance was taken.

SPANISH CABINET QUILTS AGAIN

Premier Morst Resigned Today After Incumbency of Only Few Months.

(Herald Special.) Madrid, Feb. 9.—Premier Morst resigned today after an incumbency of the office of only a few months. Senor Canalejas has been appointed by King Alfonso to accept the premiership. The entire cabinet resigned with the premier.

THREE LOST THEIR LIVES

In a Fire Which Destroyed the First National Bank Building at Jersey Shore Today.

(Herald Special.) Jersey Shore, Pa., Feb. 9.—Three people were killed as the result of a fire which early this morning destroyed the First National Bank building here. The dead are: A. L. Dravenstadt, killed by jumping from a third story window; Mrs. Dravenstadt, burned to death; William O'Connor, burned to death.

Crossed wires are said to have been responsible for the fire.

REPAIRING CARS PROBLEM.

Interesting Issue Is Submitted to the Attorney General.

Austin, Texas, Feb. 8.—Labor Commissioner Myers today submitted the question to the attorney general as to whether or not it would be a violation of the car repair law of the last legislature for railroads to send outside of the state defective cars which are leased by a railroad and not owned by them.

The Katy has sent such cars outside of the state, and when the matter was called to the company's attention it took the position that the cars belong to the Katy of Missouri. The law will be nullified should it be held that the railroads can send such leased cars out of the state.

Water Gusher Near Laredo.

Laredo, Texas, Feb. 8.—Yesterday, near the new town of Reiser, on the Texas-Mexican road, twenty-five miles from Laredo, an artesian well, when bored to the depth of 2,022 feet, sent up a column of water sixty feet above ground, which still maintains that height. This is the same place where several fine gas wells were recently opened. Geologists have long contended that Laredo was situated over the iosenene sand belts, and it was only a question of depth to bring in good artesian wells.

BROKE THE TIME RECORD

From London to California—James Coffroth, Prize Fight Promoter, Made Quick Time.

San Francisco, Cal., Feb. 9.—James Coffroth, the prize fight promoter, sent a cablegram from here this morning to Eugene Corri of London, another fight promoter, asking the latter to forward him \$1,000.00, which Coffroth won when he stepped off the ferry from Oakland at 9:25 last night. He traveled from London in nine days, six hours and fifty-five minutes, breaking all former records for the same distance journey. When he arrived he had just two hours and thirty-five minutes to spare.

SIX WERE KILLED

And a Score Injured By Explosion In a Stone Mine.

Lexington, Ky., Feb. 9.—Six people were killed and a score were injured in an explosion in a stone mine today. State Inspector Norwood has gone to the scene of the disaster.

Besides the six killed twenty others were injured in the Stearn's coal mine No. 1 at Barthell early today. The accident is what is termed by mine men as a windy explosion. Every one in the mine where the blast occurred suffered some injury.

STREET CAR TURNED OVER

Near Dalton, Mass., and One Passenger Was Killed.

Pittsfield, Mass., Feb. 9.—One man was killed and many other passengers were injured in the wreck of a Pittsfield street car early today. The car ran off the track when near Dalton, a suburb, and overturned, with the above results.

MISTROT MAYOR OF WACO.

Elected By a Majority of 384 Over J. W. Riggins.

Waco, Texas, Feb. 8.—By a majority over his opponent, J. W. Riggins, of 384, H. B. Mistrot was today elected mayor of Waco. With one exception Mistrot carried every ward of the city, losing the Third Ward by 39 votes.

Tom Hamilton was defeated for reelection as city recorder by O. M. Weatherby, who received 177 more votes than Hamilton, the next highest man.

Peary Honored By Congress.

Washington, D. C., Feb. 9.—The senate today passed a bill making Commander Robert E. Peary, the discoverer of the North Pole, a rear admiral, on the retired list.
