## CENSUS IS EXTENDED

CENSUS SUPERVISOR MADDEN GIVES PALESTINE ENUMERATORS THREE MORE DAYS TO COMPLETE THE COUNT.

Census Supervisor J. W. Madden is certainly doing all in his power to secure a full count of the population of this city, and it is up to the people here to see that the town gets all in the way of numbers it is entitled to. The following telegram has been received here:

"Crockett, Texas, May 6, 1910.  
"William F. Davis, Palestine, Texas.  
"The time for census work has been extended three more days. Please advise all census enumerators and your Board of Trade immediately.  
J. W. Madden, Supervisor."

This means that names can be received and counted up to and including Sunday night. It really leaves just one more working day, after this one, and every man and woman in Palestine should make an effort to see that no one is overlooked. Get out and canvass your neighborhood, and if you find any one that has been overlooked report the matter to the Board of Trade or to one of the enumerators. Be loyal to your home town and help to get a full count.
