THOUSANDS ARE DEAD DIAZ WILL FIGHT THEM

TWO THOUSAND PEOPLE REPORTED TO HAVE LOST THEIR LIVES IN EARTHQUAKE DISASTER IN AVELLINO, ITALY.

(Herald Special.)

Naples, June 7.—King Manuel left today for the scene of a great earthquake last night in which it is reported by the earliest reports that probably two thousand people have lost their lives, and property to the value of \$2,000,000 has been destroyed, at Avellino, five hundred miles distant. The quake extended throughout the neighboring provinces with great damage. The details at this hour are very meagre.

The large number of casualties is due to the fact that many people were in their beds when the quake occurred. Troops are being rushed to the scene.

HE WANTS QUICK ACTION

President Taft Sends Special Message to Congress Concerning the Railroad Bill.

ANNOUNCED PRESIDENT OF MEXICO WILL PERSONALLY DIRECT WAR AGAINST THE INSURGENT INDIANS OF THE REPUBLIC.

Mexico City, June 7.—President Diaz today announced that he would personally direct the attempt of the government forces to crush the rebellion now under way by the Maya Indians in Yucatan, following advice brought to him that the anti-Diaz faction is assisting the Indians, who are preparing to declare open war on the government. Gunboats are now en route to the Yucatan country and serious trouble is sure to follow, as the insurgent Indians are organized to resist the government. It is reliably reported that ten thousand Indians are now on the war path, ready for war, and that many people have already been massacred by them. Among other killed, it is said every official of Valladolid has been slain.
