BIG PARK OFFERED

MICHAUX PARK LAND COMPANY MAKES LIBERAL OFFER TO THE CITY AS TO GIFT OF PARK, TO BE KNOWN AS REAGAN PARK.

To the Honorable Mayor and Commissioners of the City of Palestine: It has for some years been the desire of practically all of the citizens of this city that a public park be acquired by the city and devoted to the use of the public.

The Michaux Park Land company is now about to open up an addition to the city of Palestine and place on sale lots, and it is willing and desirous of supplying the long felt want and have the people of Palestine provided with a park. As shown from the attached plat it can make its addition in such a way as to provide for some eight and a half acres to be used as a public park.

There is another object, which is near and dear to the hearts of the people of Palestine, for the accomplishment of which a considerable portion of the people of this city have been earnestly working for a number of years, that is the erection of a

monument to the memory of Palestine's greatest citizen, Judge John H. Reagan, loved by all who knew him. There now remains unpaid of the contract price for this monument, including interest from time it was ready for erection to date, \$2,350. It will cost to move the monument from where it is now located, set it up in this proposed park and pave the street where the pedestal now stands, the sum of \$600, making the total of \$2,950.

The Michaux Park Land company is willing, and here and now offers to sell to the city this plot of ground, embracing eight and one-half acres, to be improved and used only as a public park by the city of Palestine, for the sum of \$2,950, and to donate this money to the Reagan Monument Committee, to be by said committee used in paying the balance of the contract price for said monument, paving the street where it now stands and move same from its present location to a place to be selected in this proposed park, which park shall be known as Reagan Park.

CAMPBELL WILL ACT

SAYS JOHNSON-JEFFRIES BATTLE SHOULD NOT BE PORTRAYED IN TEXAS, AND WILL ASK LEGISLATURE FOR LAW.

Austin, Texas, July 5.—One of the first measures that Governor Campbell will submit to the special session of the legislature, which will convene here two weeks from today, will be prohibitive of moving picture exhibitions displaying the scenes of the Jeffries-Johnson prize fight. Governor Campbell, in conversation with a Galveston News correspondent tonight, made it clear that he was apprehensive of a demoralizing effect by the exhibition of the pictures in Texas. He has already noted the direct consequences of the fight as reflected by today's press dispatches. It is understood to be the governor's opinion that graphic displays of the rounds of the fight, such as moving picture machines produce are calculated to do but one thing, and that is to arouse racial feeling that may terminate in serious offences upon one side or the other. Visual demonstrations of the negro's physical supremacy over Jeffries the governor believes to be equally as vicious in their effect upon impressionable minds as were the first tidings of Johnson's victory. Perhaps they might augment the feeling. Therefore, Governor Campbell believes that it will be in the best interests of the people of Texas to prohibit moving picture exhibitions of the fight, and to that end he will invite the co-operation of the legislature.

While this action is not a counterpart it is somewhat in line with the movement of Governor Culberson to prevent by immediate legislation the proposed battle between James J. Corbett and Robert Fitzsimmons. He convoked the legislature in extraordinary session and put upon the statute books the present law prohibiting prize fights within Texas territory. The motion picture privileges brought

a fortune at Reno, and the promoters no doubt expected to reap a certain proportion of their profits from Texas fields.

C. F. Stevens announces his withdrawal from the race for congress in the Seventh district.
