TEXAS NEWS NOTES.

Bond issues to the amount of six million dollars have been approved by the attorney general's department in the past eight months.

SAN ANTONIO LEADS

Every City of Similar Size in Matter of Sidewalk Construction.

San Antonio, Texas, Oct. 11.—The report submitted to the city council by the sidewalk committee shows that San Antonio has surpassed every other of similar size in the United States in sidewalk construction. Since the campaign for better and more sidewalks was inaugurated here three and a half years ago more than one hundred and fifty miles of cement sidewalks have been constructed, in round figures costing \$450,000.

In the report the chairman of the committee says: "It will prove interesting to show that this great civic improvement has made our city the most beautiful in Texas. We venture to say that no city of the same size in the United States can equal this showing."


