Ex-Governor Geo. H. Utter is the republican candidate for congress in the Second Rhode Island district.

As was generally expected, Governor Donaghey of Arkansas has announced his candidacy to succeed United States Senator Jeff Davis.

A. J. Houston, prohibition candidate for governor of Texas, is a son of General Sam Houston, one of the most heroic figures in American history.

Mrs. Ella Reeve Bloor of Waterbury has been selected by the socialists of Connecticut as the candidate for the office of secretary of state.

As in the cases of Grover Cleveland and Charles E. Hughes, the father of Governor Judson Harmon of Ohio was a preacher.

Governor W. W. Kitchin has announced his candidacy to succeed U. S. Senator F. M. Simmons, whose term in the senate will expire March 4, 1913.

the re-election of Mr. Cannon as speaker.

Warren G. Harding, republican candidate for governor of Ohio, was a school teacher and a lawyer in his early years, before he became a newspaper editor.

According to a canvass made by a New York newspaper there are sixty-one congressional districts in which the results of the coming election are apparently doubtful.

The American party—the party in opposition to the Mormon church—is expected to be a prominent factor in the election in Utah next week. The party is already in control of Salt Lake City.

Two amendments to the constitution of West Virginia will be voted on at the coming election. One provides for an increase in the number of supreme court judges and the other is designed to enable women to serve in minor positions in the public service.

Of the six democratic members of the United States senate whose terms expire next March Senator Frazier of Tennessee appears to be the only one in danger of losing his seat. The other democratic seats then to be vacant are those of Texas, Mississippi, Virginia, Maryland and Florida.

William S. Kenyon, who, it is said, may be appointed United States senator to succeed temporarily the late Senator Dolliver of Iowa, has made a reputation as a lawyer, and is now an assistant to the attorney general of the United States, occupying the position recently held by Wade H. Ellis.

At the coming election Florida is to take a vote on the question of statewide prohibition. The Anti-Saloon Leagues and temperance organizations are working hard to put the state in the "dry" column. If they succeed it will mean that virtually the entire south will be prohibition territory.

By the death of ex-Governor Broad (whose success against Senator Tallafiero in the recent primaries made him the democratic nominee) the position of United States senator in Florida is now open to candidacy, and while some of the voters are inclined to leave the issue in the hands of the voters, many others advocate the holding of another primary.

Chicago Opera Opening.

Chicago, Nov. 3.—The hope of Chicagoans for a permanent home for grand opera has at last been realized in the remodeling at great cost of the immense Auditorium Theatre. The new house has its formal opening tonight with a performance of "Ada" by the Chicago Opera company. The season will continue for ten weeks.

Pennsylvania Congress of Mothers.

Chester, Pa., Nov. 3.—Delegates and visitors from far and near have arrived here to take part in the eleventh annual convention of the Pennsylvania Congress of Mothers and Parent Teachers' Association. The gathering has its formal opening tonight and the sessions will continue over Friday and Saturday. Mrs. George K. Johnson of Philadelphia will preside and many prominent women will be included among the speakers.

Mikado's Birthday Celebrated.

Tokio, Nov. 3.—The fifty-eighth birthday of the Emperor Mutsuhito was celebrated with great festivities today throughout Japan.

Grandfather Clause Goes In Oklahoma
Guthrie, Okla., Nov. 1.—Holding that it has no jurisdiction to grant relief from the grandfather clause of the Oklahoma constitution, the federal court today dismissed the application of Daniel Sims, a former slave, who asked a writ of injunction that would permit him and other negroes to vote at the general election November 8. This decision makes the grandfather clause operative for the election on November 8, disfranchising several thousand negroes, as the various precinct election boards are given final authority to pass on a voter's qualifications.

Exhibited the Car.

New York, Nov. 2.—With its figurehead of a Billikin still clinging to its front, the auto that Edward Rosenheimer was driving when he ran into the buggy containing Miss Grace Hough, killing her, was exhibited in the court room today when the trial of Rosenheimer was resumed. The wrecked buggy was also exhibited. Routine testimony took up the time of the trial today.

TEXAS NEWS NOTES.

The school apportionment for November is 33 1-3 cents per capita.

A thousand tons of tin plate was received at Port Arthur. The import duty was \$25,000.

The state finds the government without a title to Mustang, the life-saving state site.

Railroad Commissioner Williams is opposed to the federal regulation of railroad capitalization.

The offer to exchange state refunding bonds was turned down.

The headquarters for the St. Louis, Brownsville & Mexico road will remain at Kingsville, it is announced.

Fire insurance companies claim that expenses have not been apportioned on the proper basis.


