

## POSSIBLY A NEW ROAD

At Least the Builders Have Expressed a Desire to Build to Palestine, and May Do So.

News has been brought to Palestine that the Texas Southeastern Railroad resiresc to build to Palestine, and thence to Dallas. Perhaps the reader does not know anything about this road, where it is located, etc. For information it may be stated this road is the property of the Southern Pine Lumber company, and runs from Lufkin in a westerly direction to a town called Diboll, east of Crockett. Mr. E. C. Durham is the general manager, and he has expressed the desire to build to Palestine. In fact he has stated that it is the intention to build to Palestine. The lumber company has large holdings of pine and other timber lands in this county, one tract of fine timber being within five miles of Palestine, and the projected line would pierce these timber holdings. Besides, the plan contemplates ultimately building into Dallas, forming a splendid line from Dallas to the south-east, reaching the coast in the vicinity of Orange, perhaps. It would thus become a most important piece of railway.

The lumber company, and the men behind it, control an immense amount of money, and are thus able to put through any project they might undertake.

This is a proposition Palestine's Board of Trade should get a tow-line hitched onto.


