**MARSHALL, MO., March 18, 1890.**  
Judge Ryland, in delivering his charge to the grand jury yesterday, directed its attention to the violation of the gambling laws. He informed them that playing progressive euchre for prizes was a violation of the law and punishable as such.

#### The Knights of Honor.

To the STANDARD.

The Knights of Honor was organized in Louisville, Ky., in June 1873 with only 47 members. There are now over 2500 subordinate lodges, thirty-six grand lodges, with a membership of over 131,000. Two assessments now pay into the treasury monthly over two hundred and sixty thousand dollars. Over three millions of dollars are paid annually to the widows and orphans fund. Since its organization it has paid near thirty millions of dollars death benefits. Besides, through its subordinate lodges it contributed largely to the yellow fever sufferers in '78-9; the flood sufferers in Ohio valley in '84; the sufferers by fire in Gallatin in '85; the earthquake sufferers in South Carolina in '86; the yellow fever sufferers in Florida in '87; the Johnstown, Pa., sufferers in '89. It has also contributed several millions of dollars to members in sick benefits, and otherwise assisted in untold cases of distress and suffering.

The semi-annual meeting of the auditing committee of the K. of H. for Tennessee was held in Nashville in January. The financial condition of the order of this State is far better than ever before. The general prosperity of the order at large, is also at its highest point. Our own Mountain City Lodge, No. 140, McMinnville, Tenn., is developing increased interest and renewed vigor. This lodge has paid out in Warren County twenty-six thousand dollars to the widows and orphans of its deceased members. In almost every instance these families without this provision would have been left in necessitous circumstances.

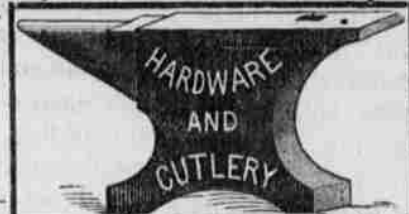
