The 64--65 Mystery

The following curious puzzle beats the celebrated "13-15-17" enigma a few years ago, and is well worth investigation. Take a strip of cardboard or paper 13 inches long and 5 wide, thus giving a surface of 65 inches. Now cut this strip diagonally, as true as you can, the result being two pieces in shape of triangles. Now measure exactly five inches from the larger end of each strip, and cut each in two pieces. Take your four pieces and put them in the shape of an exact square, and it will appear to be just 8 inches each way, or 64 square inches--a loss of 1 square inch of superficial measurement, with no diminution of surface. The question is, what becomes of that inch?
