BIDS FOR FENCE.

I will receive bids for the construction of a three wire drift fence, twelve and one-half miles long, near Red Canyon, in the San Mateo Mountains, within the Magdalena Forest Reserve. I will furnish the wire and staples, contractor to haul the same from San Marcial; to cut and haul fence posts, set the same and string and fasten wire. Requirements: fence posts to be cut from juniper and cedar timber, set in ground not less than eighteen inches, and not more than one rod apart; gates and openings to be placed at all points where fence crosses roads or trails and at such other points as may be selected in the discretion of the forest officer in charge; all work to be subject to the approval of said forest officer. 
