## PLAN BETTER RURAL SCHOOLS

Oklahoma City, July 29.—With the organization of the state rural improvement league, the executive committee of which is composed of a member of the faculty of each of the state normal schools, plans are being perfected by State Supt. R. H. Wilson to make the rural schools of the state a vital factor in the state's educational system.

The members of this committee will organize the counties of the state into district leagues, the county superintendents will organize the county into county leagues. All county superintendents and teachers will be requested to assist in making every rural school house a place of interest, inspiration and entertainment. The primary purpose of this campaign is to make the rural school house a community center in the fullest sense.

More than 2000 teachers have promised to organize evening schools for the benefit of those who cannot read and write, as well as to give assistance and help to those who can read and write and desire to improve in the fundamental principles of education.

Special attention will be given the subjects of thrift, agriculture, corn and cotton clubs, poultry, domestic science and to the building up of useful libraries which will be free to all of the residents of the community. Invitations will be extended to all who are interested in education to make public addresses on the subject of education. This will include our United States senators and congressmen, state and county officials, superintendents and teachers. A special letter will be sent to all newspapers inviting them to take an active part in the campaign, and to all ministers asking them to devote a part of their time to encouraging better educational facilities. All teachers will be urged to take a more active interest in current events to the extent that they subscribe for at least one daily paper in addition to their local paper.

Within the last year, many model schools have been established and have proved to be a success beyond expectation. With proper encouragement, there is no reason why every public school should not be made a model school.

State Supt. Wilson is preparing a bulletin for distribution which will show some interesting comparisons of city and rural schools in the length of terms, amount of money spent, and the requirements for teachers.
