Baker P. Lee, rector of a fashionable
Los Angeles church.

The bride and groom are both mem-
bers of an Eskimo colony here. The
first feature of their wedding was the
issuance of invitations inscribed on
the skins of short haired seals. In
these "bids" Mr. Kauvechna modestly
announces himself as being the rich-
est man in the world, his loads of
treasure being measured only in terms
of codfish, blubber and whale oil. He
sent these invitations to the mayors
of all cities near Ocean Park.

On the happy wedding day the
couple was joined by Rev. Lee in the
most approved, legal American fash-
ion. But that was only the beginning.
