An order was made by the court prohibiting a combination to fix the price of butter fat. The defendants were the Creamery Dairy company of Belton, Nisley Dairy company of Fort Worth, Texas Dairy company of Houston, Alamo Manufacturing company of Brownwood, and M. B. Ice Cream company of Waco.

One of the biggest poultry exhibitions ever held in this part of the country is what the Grady County Poultry association declares is to be a part of the free fair to be held here September 20, 21 and 22. Some fifty dollars in prizes are to be given and sales will be carried on for any exhibitors who wish to dispose of property, it is announced.

M. Evans, secretary of the County Poultry association and in charge of the poultry department in the county fair, said this morning.

J. Howard Sledd of Mounds, Okla., has been secured to do the judging. He will also give a talk to poultry men on the raising of marketable poultry and egg-producing strains at the least possible cost. The lecture will be free.

Entries for the poultry department should be made to the secretary, Mr. Evans.

The general health of the city of Chickasha is shown to be good, according to the report filed with the city council by Dr. E. L. Dawson, city superintendent of public health.

The report shows that during the month of August there were four cases of diphtheria, one of which proved fatal, and five cases of typhoid in the city. During the month the health superintendent made 48 visits to city patients, had the police serve 11 notices to abate nuisances and had one dead
