Judge Davenport, who was presiding in the county court, was called from the bench to the clerk's office where, in a most impressive manner he spoke the words which made the happy couple man and wife.

**Wind Smashes Window.**  
The near-cyclone which swept down upon Chickasha in a cloud of dust and a flurry of rain shortly after two o'clock yesterday afternoon, did little damage save to shade trees and a few smaller windows. One of the windows in the Masonic hall was blown out. A large section of glass from this window was carried a block west and dropped in the middle of Chickasha avenue, near the corner of Fourth street.

**Jes' Rinsin' Their Guns.**  
It was a little after 11 o'clock this morning that a riot call came into police headquarters and to the county sheriff's office stating that Homer Hilyard and Doc Watson, negroes, had started in to make corpses of each other, aided and abetted in their efforts by a brace of six guns. The police hurried to the "Two" street section of Chickasha, but arrived on the scene after the shooting had scared each negro out of the country. According to statements given out by a resident of the neighborhood, "Pshaw! Dere's nothin' wrong down heah. Jis a couple blame fool niggahs rinsin' out their guns. Nobody hurt; nobody slobbered very bad." Further information deduced the facts in the case to be that the two negroes had engaged in a war of words which culminated in each pulling his gun and taking three pot shots at the other. After the exchange of courtesies each negro left the neighborhood, one going in one direction and the other departing in another direction.

**Chicago Grain.**  
Chicago, Ill., June 21.—Wheat prices showed much nervousness today and averaged lower, largely as a result of word of an important failure in London. The close here was unsettled, a quarter to 3/8c down with July at \$1.03 to \$1.03 3/8 and September at \$1.05 1/2. Corn lost 1/8c and 1-4c to 5/8c and 3-4c and oats 1/8c and 1-4c to 1-4c and 3/8c. Provisions scored a net advance of 1/8c to 82 1-2c, the latter in pork.

**New York Cotton.**  
New York, June 21.—A further advance at the opening of the cotton market today carried all months above the 13-cent level but attracted heavy realizing and reactions followed with December contracts selling off from 13.43c to 13.27c and closing at 13.28c. The general list closed steady, net unchanged to 6 points lower.

The wire was received at Sheriff Bailey's office after 9 o'clock and investigation was immediately started which resulted in disclosing the fact that a youth answering the description of the boy wanted had passed through Chickasha at about 7:30 o'clock and had stopped at Spodeker's garage and bought a supply of gasoline. Anadarko, Lawton and El Reno officers have been communicated with and advised to look out for the auto and boy.
