## GENERAL'S DAUGHTER COMMANDS COSSACKS

Petrograd, June 27.—"South of Mahala, one of our reconnaissance patrols severely punished the enemy, causing him great losses. The leader of the patrol was Corporal Glustchenko Tcherniawka, who, though twice wounded, brought the party safely back to our lines."—Official Communiqué.

Corporal Glustchenko Tcherniawka is a woman. She bears an inhuman hatred of the enemy. The Cossack patrol which she commands is noted for its fearlessness and daring—always led by her. She is known by the enemy to be a fine soldier, but wild and brutal and relentless and unparadoning. Her patrol is known as the "Eagles," because these Cossacks swoop down, do their bloody work and disappear.

In this way the girl Cossack leader is avenging her father, Major Glustchenko, killed at the front several months ago. She arrived at the front in September and has since been recommended six times for decorations. Her soldiers worship her and her enemy has put a price on her head.

## SHIPPERS REJOICED BY RATE DECISION

Complaint was filed two years ago and was prosecuted to final victory by J. H. Johnston, of Oklahoma City, who is now a candidate for corporation commissioner on the Democratic ticket.

The reductions named in this decision which has just been received, are quite radical, and cover the entire cotton-producing section of the State of Oklahoma.

Mr. Widney, who accompanied Mr. Johnston to Kansas City and Washington when these cases were heard, gives him most of the credit for the good work done. 

### Using Old Bottles.

A bottle may be cut off by wrapping a cord saturated in coal oil around it several times, then setting fire to the cord, and just when it has finished burning plunging the bottle into cold water and tapping the end you wish to break off. Oddly shaped or prettily colored bottles make good vases. The top of a large bottle having a small neck makes a good funnel. Large round bottles make good jelly glasses.

### Cremation.

The process of cremation is as follows: The casket is lowered into the incinerating room, the metal handles and name plate are removed, and it is put into the retort. The heat is so intense that after a few hours only the ashes of the bones remain, all else, including the structure of the casket, having disappeared in light ash or gaseous products. The casket screws and nails are removed by a magnet and about four ounces of pure ash remain.
