U. S. Moves Slowly.

By United Press. Washington, August 5.—The Mexican government will enter into a general discussion of problems affecting the economic situation there as well as the matter of troop withdrawal. This information reached here in confidential messages from official sources in Mexico. The American government will not appoint its commissioners, however, until fully satisfied that the conferees can get together on a broad gauged plan for improving the Mexican conditions.

Demand 8-Hour Law.

By United Press. El Paso, Tex., August 5.—An eight-hour day for employes on all the Mexican railways has been instituted as one of a series of settlement conditions by the working classes, according to Mexico City advices.

By United Press. London, August 5.—Fourteen thousand Turks today attacked British positions near Romani, twenty-three miles east of the Suez canal. The battle is still under way but the Turks are not able to make an impression.

Berlin Reports.

By United Press. Berlin, August 5.—The British lost heavily in an unsuccessful attack in their advance north of Ovilhar. The Russians were repulsed in attempts to cross the Dvina river near Dvoten.

German Positions Fall.

By United Press. London, August 5.—The British have captured the German second line positions on a two thousand yard front north of Poziore.
