## ORDINANCE No. 607

An ordinance requiring all automobiles or motor vehicles to use dimmer lights.

Be it ordained by the mayor and City Council of the City of Chickasha, Oklahoma.

Section 1. No person shall ride, drive or propel any automobile or motor vehicle between the hours of one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise unless there shall be fastened to the front thereof at least one white light clearly visible at a distance of three hundred feet in the direction towards which said vehicle is proceeding, and a lamp or lamps so fixed and lighted as to throw a red light to the rear of such vehicle. The lights shall be so placed as to be free from obstruction by other parts of said vehicle.

No operator of any motor vehicle shall while operating the same upon any street of the city of Chickasha, use any acetylene, electric or other headlight unless it shall be so dimmed or shaded as not to blind or dazzle others using said streets or make it difficult or unsafe for them to ride, drive or walk thereon.

No person shall ride or drive a bicycle, tricycle or motorcycle on any street between the hours above mentioned without having attached to the front thereof a light clearly visible at a distance of two hundred feet.

Section 2. Any person, company or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined in any sum not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) nor more than Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00).

**Chicago Grain.**  
Chicago, August 14.—Wheat developed a marked weakness today on stop loss orders and liquidation. Possibility of the railroad strike, the Canadian crop and the federal investigation of the recent sharp advance in prices were contributory factors in the weakness. Wheat lost more than 5c in price; corn an extreme 1.5c; oats 1.5c, while provisions, despite lower holdings, were relatively firm.

The wheat market opened weak, hesitated, and then slumped hopelessly. The Canadian crop report, reflected in a slump at Winnipeg, was the principal factor. It was noted that the recent 11-cent advance seemed to have more than reflected the black rust scare and the government report. Fear of a railroad strike worked against investment. Corn was lower in sympathy with wheat.

**New York Cotton.**  
New York, August 14.—A sharp early advance in the cotton market was followed by increased offerings with December contracts selling off from 14.51 to 14.36 in the late trading and closing steady at 14.30. The general list closed steady at an advance of 7 points on August but from two to three points net lower on all the other deliveries.
