

ROBINSON TO NAME DELEGATES

County Commissioner Wants Chickasha to Get in Contest Again for Ozark Trail

Despite the fact that Chickasha does not appear on the map of competing routes for the Ozark Trail, as officially promulgated, and the further fact that Col. Harvey, president of the Ozark Trails association, has given it out that there is nothing doing for this city, County Commissioner Jas. Robinson believes that another effort should be made to place the capital of Grady county on this great national highway.

Mr. Robinson has received a request to appoint delegates to the convention which will be held in Oklahoma City on Nov. 21-22. He stated today that he would select men from all parts of the county, announcing the names within a few days. "I certainly think Chickasha should put forth her best efforts to bring the road this way," said he. Mr. Robinson received the following letter from Mayor Overholser, of Oklahoma City:

My dear sir: The Ozark Trails convention meets in Oklahoma City on Tuesday and Wednesday, November 21st and 22nd, next month, and you have authority to appoint delegates to it. It is preferable that the delegates arrive here Monday, November 20th, and get themselves quartered, as the convention will be called to order at 9 a. m. the 21st.

On the afternoon of Monday, the 20th, the weather permitting, moving pictures will be made of the delegations arriving in automobiles and motor trucks from the respective routes leading into this city from the east and west, and of Oklahoma City's reception, which will be most generous.
