KEEP OUT OF WAY OF FIRE BOYS

Fire Department Has Right of Way and Vehicles Should Stop When Alarm is Given to Note Approach

Drivers of vehicles are in peril both of their lives and of the infliction of penalties of the law when they do not stop at the approach of any part of the fire department in responding to a call.

"When a fire alarm is sounded, for the safety of the people, all vehicles should come to a complete stop until all fire apparatus has passed. Last night when No. 2 fire company turned north on Third street and Kansas avenue an automobile with a jay driver almost collided with No. 2 apparatus.

"I believe that it is a necessity for the people to stop for their own safety. When the fire department receives an alarm and is given the location they have their minds on that location and it is up to the public to stop all vehicles and give the department a chance to answer the alarm promptly.

"The people should know that the fire department has the right of way over everything. This was stated very clearly in the last traffic ordinance that was passed by the city council. But this warning is not given as a warning to those committing violations of the law but for the safety of the occupants of such vehicles and of the fire fighters in the line of duty.

TO INVESTIGATE FARM TENANTRY

Norman, Okla., Nov. 2.—(Special.)—Is farm tenantry a vital question in the state of Oklahoma right now? Is the question of interest rates to farmers a thing that demands immediate consideration? Is it possible to aid the Oklahoma farmer by getting him to adopt methods of co-operative marketing?

Authorities at the University of Oklahoma answer each of these questions in the affirmative, and they are now planning to take the first great step toward seeking a non-partisan solution to the paramount problems in the economic life of the state.

Under the auspices of the University of Oklahoma, the leading experts of the United States, the leading legislators and bankers and economists and farmers and commercial club men and county demonstration agents in the southwest, will meet for two days at Norman, Okla., on Dec. 12 and 13 to investigate the true condition of the Oklahoma farmer and seek a solution for his three great problems.

Word has already been received in Norman from a number of leading men of the country, praising the step the University of Oklahoma is taking in meeting the real problems of the state and offering their co-operation.

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PARSONS COMMENDS JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL

Norman, Okla., Nov. 2.—(Special.)—The junior high school is one of the most important among the recent developments in educational circles in Oklahoma," declares A. C. Parsons, state high school inspector from the University of Oklahoma, who has just spent some time visiting schools where the idea is being carried out.

Woodward was one of the pioneers in the work, as was Hugo, Muskogee and Chickasha adopted the system more recently, graduates of the University of Oklahoma being in charge of the work at both places.

"There are several things a junior high school does," Prof. Parsons says, not the least of which is the increased interest it is able to incite in students, who at this age are becoming tired of the grammar school subjects. In a junior high school new subjects are generally introduced, such as domestic science and manual training, and a greater freedom in selecting subjects is given students."
