What pastime my nature took millions of years to produce, a German scientist has accomplished in hours in his laboratory. To elect nine delegates at large to attend the state republican convention, which will be held in Salt Lake City on Thursday, September 5, 1912, at 11 o'clock a. m., for the purpose of nominating state officers, and
