RECEIPTS FROM LAND FOR ROAD BUILDING

APPLIES ONLY TO THE MOUNTAIN STATES.

Lands Selling at \$4 Per Acre Would Provide \$1,000,000 For Each of the Public Land States—Bill Introduced by Senator Myers.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 7.—Road construction in the Western States will be given a substantial boost if congress passes a bill recently introduced by Senator Myers of Montana, chairman of the senate public lands committee, at the request of the interior department. In terms this bill grants to each of the Western States \$50,000 acres of public lands, with authority to the states to sell the same at not less than \$4 per acre, and apply the proceeds to good roads work. Assuming the lands granted the state can be sold at the price named, the bill is equivalent to a grant of \$1,000,000 to each state for the purpose named.

As the bill was drawn by the interior department it applies only to the Rocky Mountain States, but Senator Myers expects the bill to be amended by his committee to apply to all the public land states of the West, and in that form he believes it will receive favorable consideration, both in the committee, and in the two houses of congress. This bill is the result of a movement started last session by several Western senators, who introduced bills applying to their own states only, and granting to each 1,000,000 acres of land, to be sold for the benefit of the state road fund.

GLEWS' FINANCIAL LETTER

Business Conditions Show a Slackening Tendency.

Henry Glaws of Wall street has had the following in this week's trade and finance circular:

General business continues to show a slackening tendency. This is confirmed by declining bank returns and frequently unsatisfactory reports of railroad earnings. Failures are increasing in number and volume. No improvement can be reported in the railroad situation. Many of the great companies are still embarrassed by declining net results, even where the gains in gross are satisfactory, and railroad credit is comparatively at a low ebb. The great steel industry shows decreased activity. The largest producer is only using about 80 per cent of its capacity, and prices have declined on an average about \$3.00 per ton since midsummer. The effect of the new tariff is an element of uncertainty in the steel trade, as the English and German markets have also been declining sharply, and it is quite probable that moderate quantities of foreign steel may find their way to the American seaboard. Such arrivals, however, are not expected to be of importance, except for their indirect influence upon domestic prices. The outlook is for an unsettled and fluctuating market. While general conditions are not satisfactory, still these have been very liberally discounted, as is shown by present low prices for many very desirable securities. The market has been sold almost to a standstill, and the outstanding short interest is considerable. Technically, the situation is sound, and prices would readily respond to improved conditions. For the time being, however, we can only advise conservatism in financial operations.

Recognized English Holidays.
There are now twenty-six days in the year recognized as legitimate occasions for holidays in most cities of England. These are in addition to the weekly half-holidays observed on Wednesdays or Saturdays. An effort is being made to lessen the number of holidays and to bring those retained into more systematic order.

Snake Cleared the House.
Evicted by a snake, the occupants of a house at Healy, Intermountain, Scotland, suffered an unwelcome surprise, the other day. The snake escaped from a traveling messenger and found its way into the house. This so terrified the occupants that they left the building until some men killed the reptile. A man had to dislodge two large stones in the foundations to reach the snake's hiding place.

MORE MONEY FOR THE PACIFIC FAIRS

STATE FUND ONLY ABOUT HALF ENOUGH.

Commission Decides On Campaign Among Counties to Double the Amount—Larger Share Will No Doubt Go to San Francisco.

At a meeting of the Utah commission on arrangements for exhibits at the San Francisco and San Diego fairs in 1915, held in the office of Gov. William Spry Saturday afternoon, plans were formulated for a state-wide campaign to double the funds at the disposal of the commission. Two committees were appointed which will visit the several counties of the state to ascertain what each county is willing to do. The state legislature appropriated \$50,000 and it is believed that the counties will furnish another \$50,000. Salt Lake county has practically agreed to appropriate \$10,000.

All members of the commission were agreed that more money must be used for the Utah exhibits than was appropriated by the legislature. Within a few days a special committee consisting of Governor William Spry, George Austin, L. A. Merrill and D. S. Spencer, will leave for the northern counties, visiting Weber, Cache, Box Elder, Morgan and Rich counties. Later the other committee will visit the southern part of the state.

The special committee which recently visited the cities where the fairs are to be held presented its report, but owing to the fact that the commission does not know what funds will be at its disposal, it took no action upon the report. Members of the committee are divided in their recommendations. One proposition is to expend the entire amount on the San Francisco fair, and another is to divide the \$50,000 appropriated equally between the two fairs and let all other moneys otherwise secured go to the San Francisco fair additionally.

The resignation of George Austin as treasurer of the commission was accepted and Glen Miller was appointed treasurer to succeed Austin.
