## CATTLE RECEIPTS LIGHT LAST WEEK

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Feb. 9.—Receipts for the break of 10 to 25 cents Tuesday, cattle sold pretty well this week. Receipts have been light since Tuesday, and sales yesterday, also the few cattle here today, were stronger. The cold wave sweeping over the country today, and billed to appear in the East before dissolving, is going to help the cattle market next week. Saturday is the big meat buying day in New York and other consuming centers, and the fact that last Saturday was a warm, muggy day there cut down meat sales, and left dealers with enough meat on hand to run till the middle of this week, hence the slumpy cattle market the first of this week. This condition will be reversed at the end of the week. Fancy natives would bring up to \$9, bulk of the steers, including Westerns, \$7.75 to \$8.50, old mill steers this week \$6.75 to \$8.00, heavy native cows up to \$7.50, bulls the same, calves slightly lower, best at \$10.50. Stockers and feeders eased off 10 to 25 cents this week, particularly heavy feeders, but all grades continue at the very high range of \$6.50 to \$8.00, stockers up to \$8.50.

Sheep and lambs had a very bad week. Colorado shippers loaded this week, and will in that manner tell buyers what they think of the recent break of 30 to 50 cents. Anything of quality would have sold higher today, but the 1000 head here were mostly light weight lambs, around 66 pounds, at \$7.30. Prime lambs are quotable at up to \$7.50, yearlings \$6.50, withers up to \$5.75, ewes \$5.35, with prospects favoring better prices next week.

### GREECE ASKS FOR JUSTICE.

At the request of the Greek residents of Carbon county The Advocate herewith reprints an article from the Atlantic, a Greek publication of New York. The article, under the caption, "Greece Asks For Justice," follows:

"When the Bulgarians decided upon the campaign of deception whereby they hoped to influence the outside world and shift the blame of their misdeeds, they found only two newspaper men willing to aid and abet them. They were Mr. Bourchier, of the London Times, and Mr. Wallis, of the Westminster Gazette.

"In the embattled countries or attached to the various armies were more than seventy war correspondents. Mr. Bourchier and Mr. Wallis stood alone in their partisanship for Bulgaria for reasons that will form the basis of another article. Suffice for us to say, for the purpose of this statement, that both of these gentlemen admit that they made Sofia their headquarters during all the Greco-Bulgarian war, and consequently were never eyewitnesses for or against either of the armies. In fact the Bulgarians took good care that no foreign correspondents should accompany their troops; they had determined in advance upon the extermination of the Greeks in Macedonia, and were therefore unwilling to allow followers who might become critics. On the other hand, all the war correspondents who went to the front with the Greek army are unanimous in giving testimony to the atrocities perpetrated by the Bulgarians, not only during the second campaign, but also in the Greco-Turkish war.

"The foreign correspondents attached to the Serbian army unite in denouncing the Bulgarians as murderers, mutilators, ravishers and looters. The correspondents with the Turkish army give similar testimony.

"The consummate impudence of Bulgaria leaves one amazed. They dare to face sixty-eight eye witnesses with the heinous word of two, and that hearsay of their own manufacture.

"In our last article we cited the protest of the foreign missionaries in Salonica against the Bulgarian atrocities, the testimony of an employe of the American Tobacco company at Carvalla, also the evidence of the French Catholic missionary at Kifka and the leading Turkish citizens of Dobruza, counter-signed by the local Bulgarian priests.

"We cannot too often repeat that Greece asks only for justice. Incontestable truth of her case against Bulgaria has been presented. Terrible losses were suffered by Greece both in property and men. But for her destitute she is caring with the help of her loyal sons. She now calls upon the nation that has heard her traduced for simple justice, for an unbiased hearing."
