TO REDUCE NUMBER DEATHS IN U. S. MINES

FEDERAL DEPARTMENT TAKES UP MATTER OF FIRST AID.

Many Overcome With Gas Poisoning and Electric Shocks May Be Saved By Prompt Action By Mine Employees.

Washington, Nov. 1.—In line with its campaign to reduce the number of deaths in the mines in the United States the federal bureau of mines some time ago appointed a committee of eminent physicians and surgeons to develop an efficient method of resuscitation to be administered by miners and other persons to a fellow workman overcome by electric shock or by gases in places which cannot be reached by a physician or surgeon in time to save life.

As a result of this committee's report just made, the bureau of mines, through Director Joseph A. Holmes, recommends the following procedure in rendering first aid to those in need of artificial respiration:

The recommendations apply not only to men who are overcome by electric shock or gases in mines, but also to persons suffering from the effects of illuminating gas poisoning or from electric shock anywhere. The recommendations are, therefore, of importance to many thousands of workmen.

Delay is Serious.

In case of gas poisoning remove victim at once from the gaseous atmosphere. Carry him quickly in fresh air and immediately give manual artificial respiration. Do not stop to loosen clothing. Every moment of delay is serious.

In case of electric shock break electric current immediately. Free the patient from the current with a single quick motion, using any dry non-conductor, such as clothing, rope or board, to move patient or wire. Be wary of using any metal or moist material. Meantime have every effort made to shut off current.

Attend instantly to victim's breathing. If the victim is not breathing he should be given manual artificial respiration at once.

If the patient is breathing slowly and regularly do not give artificial respiration, but let nature restore breathing unaided.

In gas cases give oxygen. If the patient has been a victim of gas give him pure oxygen, with manual artificial respiration.

To Give Oxygen.

The oxygen may be given through a breathing bag from a cylinder having a reducing valve, with connecting tubes and face mask, and with an inspiratory and an expiratory valve, of which the latter communicates directly with the atmosphere.

No mechanical artificial resuscitating device should be used unless one operated by hand that has no suction effect on the lungs.

Use the Schafer or prone pressure method of artificial respiration. Begin at once. A moment's delay is serious.

Continue the artificial respiration. If necessary, continue two hours or longer without interruption until natural breathing is restored. If natural breathing stops after being restored use artificial respiration again. Do not give the patient any liquid until he is fully conscious.

Give him fresh air, but keep his body warm.

Send for nearest doctor as soon as accident is discovered.

The members of the committee reporting to the bureau of mines is as follows: Dr. W. B. Cannon, chairman, professor of psychology, Harvard university; Dr. George W. Crile, professor of surgery, Western Reserve university, Cleveland; Dr. Joseph Krieger, professor of physiology, Washington university, St. Louis; Dr. Yandell Henderson, professor of physiology, Yale university, and Dr. R. J. Meitzer, head of the department of physiology and pharmacology, Rockefeller Institute for Medical Research.

ALASKA GOLD DEPOSITS SURPRISE GEOLOGISTS

SALT LAKE PEOPLE PROMINENTLY INTERESTED.

Prospects Are Very Flattering With Placer Finds Running Into Hundreds of Thousands of Dollars—Plant Installed.

George W. Bias of the Valdez Creek placer mine returned last week to Salt Lake City from Alaska, where he has spent the entire season installing \$100,000 worth of machinery which began washing August 27 and closed September 25, when the mercury went down to zero, says the Boston News Bureau. Everything is now in shape for a full season of washing next season. In discussing Alaska and its mines, Mr. Bias says:

We didn't have time to clean out the bed of rock, where I estimate here is a good \$100,000, but from the boxes we took out \$1200, and in doing assessment work on our claim we picked up \$70,000, more than \$3000 of which was in nuggets, some of which would run as high as \$10. Some day's work would yield as much as \$100 per wash. Our thirty-six inch pipe line is over a mile long and is under a 350-foot head. It carries more than 2000 miner's inches of water every twenty-four hours.

In Alaska they figure on five cubic yards of gravel washed per miner's inch, but if we do next season only three cubic yards per inch each day we should wash 6000 yards a day. The gravel bank has returned \$2.75 per cubic yard, but estimated at only \$1 per cubic yard, we shall be making \$1000 per year all the money that we could ask for. We have spent over \$700,000 in the Valdez Creek properties and expect to be taking out more than that every year.

The working time in Alaska for hydraulicking is about 150 days. The Guggenheims, operating about 100 miles west of us, took out \$2,000,000 in dredging this season, but we can hydraulic cheaper than they can dredge. I expect in a few years to be returning a million gold a year from our property.

No man can go to Alaska today without returning an enthusiast on the prospective gold output from that country. I spent a whole day at Jansen going over the Alaska Gold Mines property. That is destined to be the greatest gold camp in the world. Alaska Gold has tunneled the mountain for two miles, and you do not need a magnifying glass to see the stringers of gold right through the mountain. I don't believe this mountain can be worked out in a hundred years.

The layout of the Alaska Gold Mines company in its engineering is most scientific and on the biggest scale of any gold mine in the world. The output of this mine, combined with the Alaska Treadwell and what the United States Mining people are doing in the same region will give Jansen a gold yield that will rival that of the Rand in South Africa.

Notwithstanding the handicap of the climate, I believe Alaska will within a reasonable number of years astonish the world. The Alaska bills which have passed congress will give a great stimulus to this territory. Broad Pass, where the government will probably build the Alaskan railroad, has had a tremendous gold strike. The outcrop is claimed to be fifty feet wide and has been traced for miles.

The government estimates that the territory through which this road will probably pass is capable of sustaining a population of 25,000,000 on its mineral and agricultural resources. The Alaska gold fields are bigger than the Pennsylvania coal fields.


