Utah beets were compared with those of France and Germany, and in appearance did not suffer by the comparison. Of course in the European countries the culture of beets is now perfection, while in this territory it is with many of the farmers an entire experiment. However, Mr. Cutler took occasion to congratulate the Utah farmers on the good they are doing, and stated that the indications are that while the tonnage for this year would probably be no heavier than for the past year the percentage of saccharine matter will be greater, and therefore the yield of sugar considerably increased. Beet harvesting will begin September 3d, and the factory will begin operations on September 7th.


