Grand Lodge Officers' Visit.

On Tuesday night, January 24th, Grand Chancellor Pike, accompanied by Grand K. of R. & S., H. C. Wardleigh, Grand Prelate, Chas. P. Jennings and Grand Master of Exchequer, Geo. R. Stoney and acting Grand Vice Chancellor, Nesbit and acting Grand Master—Arthur, Robert Shelton, officially visited Garden City Lodge No. 10, Provo.

After the regular order of business had been transacted, and the Rank of Page beautifully conferred on a candidate, the lodge was turned over to the Grand Lodge officers.

Grand Chancellor Pike addressed the members in an able manner, paying the lodge a high compliment on the manner in which they conferred the rank work. He then discussed briefly the subject of religion in the order, saying that he had been asked by a member of the lodge whether a Mormon could become a member of the order? In reply he would say he could not see the reason why he could not, provided he was a man that fulfilled the requirements of an applicant for membership in the Order. It made no difference as to what a man's religious belief was so far as becoming a Knight of Pythias was concerned—the Order did not shape the creed of any member, whether he be Mormon, Catholic or any other denomination so long as he was morally and physically a man. He said, never ask an applicant for membership his religion. He also spoke of the recent edict issued by the Pope of Rome removing the "ban" from the Knights of Pythias and permitting Catholics to join the Order. He also expressed his views upon the matter of reducing the Grand Lodge expenses. The Grand Chancellor then called upon "Uncle Robert" Shelton, of Salt Lake City, one of the oldest Pythians in the domain.

He responded by telling the members of his experiences at Provo 37 years ago, and how he at that time walked

from Salt Lake to that city, and was compelled to ford the river carrying his clothes on his head, the bridge having been washed away.
He was followed by G. K. of R. & S. Wardleigh, who in speaking of the seemingly lack of interest by the members in the Order and how to increase this interest said it was not the generals who won the battles in war, but the "men behind the guns" were the ones who did the work. He said it was the same in the Order of the Knights of Pythias, the Supreme, the Grand or Subordinate Lodge officers could not build up and increase the attendance and membership without the assistance of the "men behind the guns"—the working members of the Order. It was for all to put their shoulders to the wheel and push it on and upward to victory.

Grand Prelate Jennings also made some very appropriate remarks, and after a few words from Bro. Nesbit, of Eureka, the members adjourned to the Maigo restaurant, where a sumptuous repast was served and the inner man's hunger appeased. It was almost one o'clock when all departed for home, voting the members of Garden City Lodge to be royal entertainers and true Knights of Pythias.—Western Knight, Salt Lake.


