UTAH COUNTY MAN MEETS DEATH IN MINE

Miram V. Smith, a carpenter of Payson, was visiting at Silver City last Sunday, accompanied by his wife and children, and the family were the guests of Colin McMurphy.

He was absent long enough to alarm his wife and she could not see him. She quelled her fears, thinking he had gone up to the town. But Smith did not return that night, and Monday morning Mrs. Smith notified Sheriff Henroid of Eureka and other officers of the district and a systematic search was established.

After the body was brought to the surface through the Swansen mine, it was found that the shaft had been covered in accordance with the laws of the district, but the earth had caved in from under the collar and a crust of earth was left on the surface.

Deceased leaves a wife and three children and other relatives in Payson. The body was shipped to Payson yesterday and will be buried there.
