**NOTHING DEFINITE.**  
A Few Straws to Show Which Way the Railroad Wind is Blowing.  
The San Francisco Bulletin of the 27th, ult., says: "The Oregon Pacific is planning to put on more steamers between this port and Yaquina. Negotiations are pending, which if concluded, will be a benefit to that section of the country. There has been a general theory from the first that the Chicago & Northwestern company was interested in the Oregon Pacific, and that some day the two would form a transcontinental line. It is now learned that the matter of backing and connections are now being considered officially by the directors of the companies. Whether the lines will unite depends upon the decision of a few men, but there is the best authority for the statement that the topic is now being regarded from a favorable point of view."  
In response to an inquiry by a Portland News reporter about work on the Oregon Pacific, Wallis Nash replied: "Nothing definite has been done as yet. Chief Engineer Eckerson has just returned from Eastern Oregon, where he has been re-locating some lines surveyed last summer, whereby he has saved considerable distance in the roadbed. As to whether anything will be done yet this summer, I am unable to say. General Manager Hoag is expected to arrive soon from San Francisco, and after his arrival affairs will most undoubtedly assume a definite form and the work of construction be resumed."

**Horrible Fate of Six Tramps—Warring Kansas Towns.**  
The towns of Woodsdale and Hugotown, Stevens county, Kansas, are rivals. On Thursday, July 26, Sam Robinson, City Marshal of Hugotown, and M. Cook, of the same place, went to a ranch some miles from town, accompanied by their wives, to look up some cattle. While taking dinner the deputy sheriff, a Woodsdale man, accompanied by five other Woodsdale men, rode up to the party and asked Robinson to surrender, as he had a warrant for his arrest. Robinson said he would go a short distance from camp, leaving Cook and the ladies behind, and then give his enemies a chance to take him. He did so and on reaching a convenient spot both parties opened fire with the result that four Woodsdale men were slain. The other two fled and Robinson escaped without a scratch. Cook hastened to Hugotown and gave the alarm and soon an armed squad went to their assistance. Meeting a lot of Woodsdale men, an encounter took place in which three more men were killed and a number wounded. The citizens of Woodsdale have ordered 100 Winchester and a wagon load of ammunition.  
Six tramps were killed one day this week in a railroad accident in Southwestern Nebraska. Unfortunately for them they happened to be secreted in an ill-fated old car that was loaded with shelled corn, and met their fate in what must have been the most tragic manner imaginable. When the train crew, two hours after the accident, began tearing away pieces of the broken car, imagine their surprise when the dead body of a man was discovered. They continued the rescue until six lifeless forms were taken from the debris.  
Frank McGurran, of Salt Lake City, at Cincinnati, Ohio, won the championship of the world as a typewriter. In a contest of ninety minutes he wrote 8,800 words—almost ninety-six words a minute.

**Investigate the Arid Region.**  
One of the items of the sundry civil bill which has been adopted by the U. S. Senate, appropriates \$250,000 for the purpose of investigating the extent to which the arid region of the United States can be redeemed by irrigation. In order to shut out speculators the item was amended by the following: "And all lands which may be designated for reservoirs and canals for irrigation, shall be reserved as the property of the United States and shall not be subject to entry or settlement until it shall be hereinafter provided by law."
