Caldwell, Idaho, July 18th, 1904. The Board of County Commissioners met at 10 o'clock a. m. pursuant to adjournment from July 16th; all members of the Board being present when the following proceedings were had:

It appearing to the Board of County Commissioners that it is necessary that some measures should be taken to have waste water from irrigated fields kept out of public roads and highways, on motion, the county attorney is directed to prepare and send to the road to the road overseers of the respective road districts in Canyon county, Idaho, an order directing said overseers to notify all parties allowing waste water to run into and over the public roads and highways in Canyon county, that it must be immediately stopped and if there is any further violation of the law in that respect, that the road overseer be instructed to file the necessary complaint and have the offenders prosecuted as provided by the laws of the State of Idaho.

In the matter of the petition of R. L. Morrow, et al, praying for the establishment of a public highway in road district No. 15, it appearing to the Board that the viewers report thereon is incomplete in that it does not show that the viewers were sworn as required by law, and said report is not properly signed, therefore on motion it is ordered that said petition be laid over and the viewers report be referred back to the viewers for correction.

In the matter of the petition of G. W. Hodson, et al, praying for the establishment of a public highway leading from the City of Caldwell to the Caldwell cemetery it appearing to the Board that said petitioners have not complied with the law in respect thereto and that there is no bond accompanying it, therefore, on motion, it is ordered that the said petition be referred back to said petitioners for the reason that same is incomplete.

In the matter of the petition of I. S. Froman, et al, praying for the establishment of a public highway in road district No. 27 it appearing to the Board that said petition is not accompanied by a bond as required by law and that the description is not complete therefore, on motion, it is ordered that the said petition be referred back to said petitioners.

In the matter of the petition of S. W. Vail, et al, praying for the establishment of a public highway in road district No. 20 it appearing to the Board that said petition does not show over what land said road is to run or who the owners are, therefore, on motion, it is ordered that said petition be referred back to said petitioners for further information.

In the matter of the petition of J. T. Stafford et al, praying for the establishment of a public highway in road district No. 24. It appearing to the Board that the viewers report thereon does not show that the viewers were sworn as provided by law and that said report is contradictory in that it estimates damages in the sum of \$120 and again recites that the cost of opening will be only \$60, therefore, on motion it is ordered that the said petition be laid over and that the viewers report be referred back for correction.

In the matter of the petition of A. G. McFarland et al, praying for the establishment of a public highway. It appearing to the Board that the bond accompanying said petition is not good for the reason that the bondsmen have not justified and said petition fails to show the number of the road district in which the proposed road is situated and further the petition fails to show any necessity for said road or its advantages if laid out as required by law, therefore, on motion it is ordered that said petition be referred back for the corrections as above mentioned.

In the matter of the petition of R. L. Morrow, et al, praying for the establishment of a public highway in road district No. 27, it appearing to the Board that no consent in writing has been given for the right of way for the road and no relinquishments have been filed and the viewers' report does not show that damages were awarded to non-consenting land owners and there is no evidence that the viewers were sworn as required by law, therefore, on motion, it is ordered that the petition be laid over and the report of the viewers be referred back for correction.

In the matter of the petition of L. S. Dille et al, praying for a public highway in road district No. 15, it appearing to the Board that the viewers report thereon is incomplete in that it does not show that the viewers were sworn as required by law, and said report is not properly signed, therefore on motion it is ordered that said petition be laid over and the viewers report be referred back to the viewers for correction.

In the matter of the petition of F. R. Odle, et al, praying for the establishment of a public highway in road district No. 23 it appearing to the Board that the viewers report thereon is incomplete, in that it is signed by only two of said viewers, therefore on motion it is ordered that said petition be laid

over and that the said viewers report be referred back to said viewers for correction.

In the matter of the petition of G. W. Hodson, et al, praying for the establishment of a public highway leading from the City of Caldwell to the Caldwell cemetery it appearing to the Board that said petitioners have not complied with the law in respect thereto and that there is no bond accompanying it, therefore, on motion, it is ordered that the said petition be referred back to said petitioners for the reason that same is incomplete.

It appearing to the Board that the viewers report thereon does not show that the viewers were sworn as provided by law and that said report is contradictory in that it estimates damages in the sum of \$120 and again recites that the cost of opening will be only \$60, therefore, on motion it is ordered that the said petition be laid over and that the viewers report be referred back for correction.

In the matter of the petition of A. G. McFarland et al, praying for the establishment of a public highway. It appearing to the Board that the bond accompanying said petition is not good for the reason that the bondsmen have not justified and said petition fails to show the number of the road district in which the proposed road is situated and further the petition fails to show any necessity for said road or its advantages if laid out as required by law, therefore, on motion it is ordered that said petition be referred back for the corrections as above mentioned.

In the matter of the petition of R. L. Morrow, et al, praying for the establishment of a public highway in road district No. 27, it appearing to the Board that no consent in writing has been given for the right of way for the road and no relinquishments have been filed and the viewers' report does not show that damages were awarded to non-consenting land owners and there is no evidence that the viewers were sworn as required by law, therefore, on motion, it is ordered that the petition be laid over and the report of the viewers be referred back for correction.

In the matter of the petition of L. S. Dille et al, praying for a public highway in road district No. 15, it appearing to the Board that the viewers report thereon is incomplete in that it does not show that the viewers were sworn as required by law, and said report is not properly signed, therefore on motion it is ordered that said petition be laid over and the viewers report be referred back to the viewers for correction.

In the matter of the petition of F. R. Odle, et al, praying for the establishment of a public highway in road district No. 23 it appearing to the Board that the viewers report thereon is incomplete, in that it is signed by only two of said viewers, therefore on motion it is ordered that said petition be laid
