

## Commissioners' Proceedings.

Caldwell, Idaho, Sept. 27, 1905.  
The Board of County Commissioners of Canyon County, Idaho, met at 10 o'clock A. M. pursuant to adjournment from 11th inst. All members of the Board being present when the following proceedings were had.

This being the day fixed for the canvass of the vote of the Special Election held on September 23rd, 1905, for the purpose of submitting to the people the question of bonding the county to build a new court house but the returns from New Plymouth Precinct not having been filed with the Clerk whereupon the Board adjourned until 10 o'clock tomorrow morning.

The Board of County Commissioners met at 10 o'clock A. M. pursuant to adjournment from yesterday, all members of the Board being present when the following proceedings were had:

The returns from all the precincts of the Special Election, held Sept. 23rd, 1905 having been received and filed with the Clerk, whereupon the Board proceeded with the canvass of the vote of such Special Election and hereby make the following declaration of the result of such Special Election, to-wit:

It appearing from the above returns that more than two-thirds of the total number of votes cast at said Special Election were for the issue of bonds by Canyon County in the sum of \$62,605.20 for the building of a new Court House. It is hereby declared that such question carried and the Board of County Commissioners of Canyon County, Idaho are authorized by said vote to issue negotiable, interest bearing Canyon County Bonds in the sum of \$62,605.20, to provide funds for the erection of a new court house for Canyon County at the present court house site in Caldwell, Idaho. And it is ordered that the Chairman and Clerk of this Board publish the following notice of Bond Sale in the Caldwell Tribune for a period of twenty days:

Notice is hereby given, that

Canyon County, State of Idaho, by and through the Board of County Commissioners of said Canyon County, Idaho, will on Monday at 10 o'clock A. M. the 23rd day of October, 1905, at the County Court House of said Canyon County, Idaho in the office of the County Clerk and Auditor of said county the same being the place of business of the said Board of County Commissioners sell bonds of said Canyon County Idaho to the amount of \$62,605.20 the sale of which said bonds were duly authorized by a vote of the qualified electors of said Canyon County at a special bond election held in Canyon County, Idaho on the 23rd day of September, 1905, in pursuance of an act of the Legislature of the State of Idaho, entitled: "An Act Providing for the Issuance of Negotiable Coupon Bonds for the Funding and Refunding of County Indebtedness; Amending Chapter 6, Title XIII Revised Statutes of Idaho," approved February 7th, 1899, said sale having been directed by the Board of County Commissioners of said Canyon County subject to a vote of the qualified electors of said Canyon County on the 21st day of August 1905.

Said bonds shall be payable in lawful money of the United States as follows: At the expiration of ten years from date of issue of said bonds, ten per cent of the whole number of said issue; at the expiration of eleven years from the date of issue, ten per cent of said issue, and ten per cent annually thereafter until all of said bonds are paid, but it shall be optional with said county to redeem all or any part of said bonds at any time after the expiration of ten years from the date of said issue, and each bond shall so recite upon its face the said option. Each bond must be redeemed in the order it is numbered and shall bear interest at the rate of not to exceed six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of January and the first day of July of each year. The principal and interest shall be payable at the office of the County Treasurer of Canyon County, Idaho or at the Chase National Bank of the city of New York. Said bonds shall be each of the denomination of one thousand dollars for the first sixty two of said bonds, five hundred dollars for the sixty third, and one hundred and five and 20 one 100th dollars for the sixty fourth bond. The total number of said bonds being sixty four. Said bonds shall be numbered consecutively and shall bear the date of the same time of their issue. Said bonds shall be signed by the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners, shall be attested by the Clerk of said Board and bear the seal of said Board, and shall be countersigned by the County Treasurer of said County and shall be negotiable in form. Each bond

shall state upon its face the amount for which the same is issued, the date of its issue, time and place of payment, rate of interest, and must also recite that it is issued in conformity with the provisions of said Act hereinbefore described by title and said Act must be printed upon the back of each bond. There shall be attached to each bond, when negotiated, semi-annual interest coupons covering the interest expressed in the bond from the date of the issue until paid, and the coupons annexed to each bond shall be signed by the County Treasurer of said Canyon County. Each coupon must bear a number corresponding to the number of the bond to which it is attached, and must state upon its face the amount for which the same is issued the date of issue and the date and place of payment thereof. Sealed proposals will be received by the said Board of County Commissioners of Canyon County Idaho at their said office and place of business in the Court House of Canyon County for the purchase of said bond until the day and hour above mentioned namely up to 10 o'clock A. M. on October 23rd, 1905. The said Board reserves the right to reject any and all bids and to make such allotments as may be for the benefit of said Canyon County, Idaho. No bids will be considered for less than par value and accrued interest. Said bonds are offered in sums less than the whole amount to be issued, or total amount at the option of the bidder. All bids for bonds must be accompanied by a certified check in the sum of two per cent of the amount of bonds bid for, such check to be drawn in favor of John A. Tucker, Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners of Canyon County, and to have no conditions endorsed thereon, except as set out in this notice. Said bids will be opened by the Board of County Commissioners at the time and place mentioned and in the presence of all persons wishing to attend. Bids should state rate per cent per annum.

Parties bidding on these bonds are requested to have the legality of the same passed upon by their counsel before submitting their bids and, particularly before the day set for the opening of said bids and dated September 25th, 1905.

In the matter of the appointment of a Justice of the Peace for North Payette Precinct. It appearing to the Board that a vacancy exists in said precinct and that such appointment is necessary, and a request having been made for the appointment of F. A. Smith as Justice of the Peace for the North Payette Precinct, and his bond is accepted and approved.

On motion, Board adjourned sine die.
