COUNTY COMMISSIONERS' DOINGS

Caldwell, Idaho, October 9, 1905.
First day of the Regular Session.

October, 1905

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session at 10 o'clock pursuant to law. Present: Commissioners F. E. Fiske, chairman, D. P. Dodd and J. F. T. Bays. Clerk John A. Tucker, when the following proceedings were had:

In the matter of the application of the Clerk of the District Court to the Auditor and Recorder for authority to appoint a clerical assistant to serve in his office under the provisions of Section 4 of an act entitled, "An act to provide for the payment of salaries to county officers, etc." approved March 7, 1899. It appearing to the Board that a necessity exists therefor, and due proof of the publication of the notice of the intention of the said officer to make said application, as required by said Section 4, having been furnished the Board, therefore on motion, it is ordered that said application be granted and said officer is hereby empowered and authorized to employ a clerical assistant to serve in his office. And it is further ordered that the salary of such clerical assistant be and the same is hereby fixed at \$60.00 per month, payable out of the treasury of Canyon County, Idaho, quarterly and in the same manner as is provided for the payment of County officers.

In the matter of the petition of G. M. Moore et al, praying for the establishment of a public highway in road district No. 13, on motion denied.

In the matter of the petition of Charles J. F. Peterson et al, praying that a private road be established in road district No. 12, on motion denied.

In the matter of the petition of Wilson Leiser et al, praying that a public road be established in road district No. 19, which has not been viewed as ordered at the July meeting; it now appearing to the board that the road as prayed for is but one half mile in length and would not make an outlet and be of public benefit, therefore, on motion, it is ordered that the former order of this board appointing viewers and ordering said road viewed be annulled and set aside; and it is further ordered that said petition be denied.

Moss et al, praying that a public road be established in road district No. 3, it appearing that there are no non-consenting land owners, whereupon, it is ordered that the petition be laid over and the petitioners required to procure and file with said petition the written releases of the owners of the land for the right of way thereto.

In the matter of the viewers' report on the petition of C. B. Hampson et al, praying that a public road be established in road district No. 12, having its points of beginning and termination, course and intermediate points as follows: Fifty feet in width, commencing at the northwest corner of section 11, in township 5 north of range 4 west of Boise Meridian in said Canyon county, running thence south on the section line between sections 10 and 11, 15 and 14, 22 and 23, and 26 and 27 of said township to the southwest corner of 26, ending at the county road at the southwest corner of section 26, in said township.
