SEPTEMBER 29-30 ARE DATES.
Preparations for the Emmett Fair are booming right along and there is no question but that in quality and variety of exhibits all previous efforts will be surpassed. There is a lack of enthusiasm and the farmers and townspeople are working hard in hand.
The financial question was settled yesterday when a committee in a short time secured pledges amounting to \$700 in cash and prizes among the business men. Farmers will be asked to contribute, also. It is estimated that \$1,000 will be required to make creditable exhibits at the precinct, county and state fairs. A visit to the commercial rooms will show what is being done.

The grape display will be the pronounced feature of the Emmett exhibit, and will for the first time show the adaptability of the Emmett country to grape culture. The display of Tokays will be a revelation. Those who have seen it say it far surpasses California's best efforts. Peter Ries yesterday added to the display specimens of a number of mammoth bunches from his 2-year-old vineyard. One bunch weighs 3 1/2 pounds and is a beautiful specimen.—Emmett Index.

BONDS ARE SOLD.
Confidence is restored, and that feeling of unrest regarding the Canyon canal, now known as the Emmett Irrigation district, is placed on a shelf forever—the bonds are sold.
The sale was made to a syndicate of bondholders of the old company, formed in Chicago, and is subject to the legal and physical examination of the bonds and to the time when the bonds will be engraved, signed and delivered to the depository, at the Fort Dearborn bank, in Chicago, which time \$50,000 will be paid in cash and a like amount will be paid the district every 30 days thereafter, until \$250,000 is paid. The remainder will be paid on or before April 1, 1912.
In the meantime the bondholders of the old company will be satisfied on the exchange of the bonds and on the holding notes, etc., against the company, will be assured of their payment.

This amount will relieve the local financial situation and give us plenty of money to go ahead and make the repairs on the ditch.
The directors have acted wisely in making the sale and the local banks and the merchants who have stood back of the proposition with their dollars are to be congratulated.
The knockers on Emmett's greatest irrigation project will now have to take to the tall uncut.—Emmett Examiner.
